Every day since Friday, the San Jose community has organized peaceful protests for justice and against police violence. How did San Jose Police respond? The police showed up with armored vehicles and riot gear. The police beat people with batons. The police shot people with rubber bullets. The police used tear gas in the middle of the COVID pandemic—an act of biological warfare.
