SUBJECT: APPROVAL OF THE TERMS OF AN AGREEMENT WITH THE SAN JOSE POLICE OFFICERS' ASSOCIATION (SJPOA) FOR THE TERM

OF JULY 1, 2020 THROUGH JUNE 30, 2021

RECOMMENDATION

Adopt a resolution approving the terms of a collective bargaining agreement between the City and the San Jose Police Officers' Association (SJPOA) for the term of July 1, 2020 through June 30, 2021, and authorizing the City Manager to execute the agreement with those terms.

OUTCOME

Adoption of the resolution and authorization to execute an agreement would result in a collective bargaining agreement between the City and the San Jose Police Officers' Association (SJPOA) and authorize the City Manager to execute an agreement with a term of July 1, 2020, through June 30, 2021.

BACKGROUND

The SJPOA represents approximately 1,149 full-time budgeted positions in the San José Police Department. This bargaining unit includes employees in the classifications of Police Recruit, Police Officer, Police Sergeant, Police Lieutenant, Police Captain, and Deputy Chief of Police.

The Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) between the City and the SJPOA is set to expire on June 30, 2020. A complete copy of this agreement can be found at: https://www.sanjoseca.gov/home/showdocument?id=32017.

A Tentative Agreement has been reached to extend the current MOA for the period of July 1, 2020 through June 30, 2021. Specifically, the Tentative Agreement extends the current MOA between the City and the SJPOA that is set to expire on June 30, 2020, which results in the

current terms rolling over for another year. The Tentative Agreement, however, contains a one-time reopener to meet and confer over compensation increases during the term of the successor MOA and a one-time reopener to meet and confer over revisions to the San Jose Police Department policies, procedures and practices to support improved police and community outcomes. As such, discussions related to these issues will continue during the term of the successor MOA, i.e., from July 1, 2020 through June 30, 2021.

The Tentative Agreement on a successor MOA is pending ratification by the POA membership. The POA will notify the City of the ratification results prior to the June 30, 2020, City Council meeting.

ANALYSIS

A complete copy of the Tentative Agreement is attached (Attachment A). The following is a summary of the key provisions of the Tentative Agreement.

Term

The agreement will be effective July 1, 2020 through June 30,

2021.

Reopeners

The City and POA agree to a one-time reopener to meet and confer over compensation increases during the term of the successor MOA.

During the term of the successor MOA, the City and the POA further agree to a one-time reopener to meet and confer over revisions to the San Jose Police Department policies, procedures and practices to support improved police and community

outcomes.

CONCLUSION

It is recommended that the City Council adopt the Administration's recommendation outlined in this memorandum which would allow the City Manager to execute an agreement with the terms of a collective bargaining agreement between the City and the SJPOA with a term effective July 1, 2020, through June 30, 2021.

EVALUATION AND FOLLOW-UP

No further follow-up action with the Council is expected at this time.
