Hello,

I have lived in the Olinder neighborhood since 2009. My kids were born shortly after we moved in and I spent almost every day walking/jogging the Olinder neighborhood and the loop around Olinder park (trying to shed the baby weight!). I felt safe with my babies back then. As they grew, we enjoyed the two playgrounds daily and created so many lasting memories at the Olinder sports fields once they started playing organized baseball and soccer. We've had family Easter egg hunts, pickup softball games and even a mud football birthday party! Olinder was a place for families to gather and for neighbors to meet...that is no longer the case.

Over the past few years Olinder park and Coyote Creek have been inundated with homeless people, trash, drug use, violence, burning of wiring, fires and air pollution. It's pretty much the Jungle, just a little further north. I don't understand why this area is now being neglected.

I've been jogging with my now pre-teens during this shelter in place and we don't feel safe at all. We played tennis at Olinder park Friday morning and were harassed by two homeless men by the bathrooms who were clearly high. I was so scared that they would physically attack me or my boys...it was an awful feeling to have as a mother. We need your attention and help with relocating these encampments from our neighborhood and school community. We need the city and the water district to clean up the trash in the parks and creeks, water the grass, increase police presence. Each one of you has had my support and/or vote over the years...please support my family and neighbors by sending resources to our park!

Please help us take our neighborhood park back!!!

Dear City Planners,

The District 6 Neighborhood Leaders Group (D6NLG), an association established over a decade ago, is comprised of officers, board members and involved community representatives from the multitude of neighborhood associations across District 6 in San José. We have been involved for years in advocating for developing San José into a safe, attractive, and inviting city.

We oppose the proposals to permit the installation of Electronic Billboards along San José's freeways. We object for a number of reasons:

Safety: Driving in San José can be challenging. San José has signed on to a "Vision Zero" program to move "toward zero traffic deaths and providing safe streets for all, as soon as possible." We certainly don't need flashing displays, which are *designed* to attract our attention, to be lining our freeways.

Additionally, Fwy. 87 is in the flight-path of San José International Airport and may distract approaching pilots.

Environment: A number of the proposed locations (e.g., on Fwy. 87 along the Guadalupe River, or I280 crossing the Los Gatos or Coyote) are near sensitive riparian habitats, home to wildlife including beaver, wild salmon, and numerous migratory birds. They don't need any additional "light pollution". Light from the electronic billboards is likely to be detrimental to them, by disrupting their sleep, making them more visible to predators, and distracting them as they fly along the creek corridors. The billboard's flashing lights may disturb the sleep of nearby humans as well.

Aesthetics: Freeway 87 and I280 have historically been officially classified as "scenic highways": this is the reason they, unlike Fwy. 237 and US 101, are not already lined with billboards, and also the reason why visitors approaching San José can get a pleasant view of our growing Downtown skyline. What are the ramifications of foregoing the scenic highway designation: would grants need to be refunded? And what are the other financial implications? Yes, the City might collect some additional fees, but it can also lose out from fewer people wanting to stop and visit in a trashy-looking town that is hemmed in with garish billboards. Would the city even come out ahead overall?

We in District 6 live quite close to the proposed locations of these billboards. We enjoy our city, and have appreciated past efforts to make the city more beautiful. Please do not trash it now with flashing electronic billboards.

Subject: The Color of Law: The Real Cause of Racial Disparity in Real Estate

Dear Honorable Mayor, Council, and City Staff,

The Color of Law is a must read book. It highlights how the Government systematically created racial disparity in real estate.

It is clear, based on recent and proposed regulations, the City of San Jose wants a small group of small businesses (mom and pop rental providers, developers, and builders) to give the Government money to fix this problem.

I hope you will read this book and ask the question: Can the entity that created the problem solve the problem?

Here's how it goes:

1. There is a problem.
2. Government enacts a regulation to solve the problem.
3. This rarely solves the problem because the people who work in the Government study public policy and rarely understand business or economics. Instead, this regulation creates a new problem usually worse than the problem it was meant to solve.
4. Government enacts a new regulation to solve the new problem they created.
5. And the cycle continues. Meanwhile, supply remains limited and prices inevitably increase.

Given the recent news stories on The City of San Jose's failed housing experiment and on how much it costs the Government to provide housing (\$1 billion received by the Housing Department in the past 5 years and less than 1,000* people housed. Source Audit Reports), I hope you will reconsider the approach you have been taking for the past 5 years as it is NOT working. (*Note: This does not include the 1,250+ who received beds during COVID. Source City Council Meeting.)

Government funded housing projects in the 50's and 60's didn't work. It created ghettos and fostered racial disparity. It's especially concerning that the City is taking this failed approach. Those who ignore history are doomed to repeat it. (Note: Government Housing is specifically why Section 8 was established and government housing was eliminated. Section 8 does work.)

The Government is not measured on results or efficiency the same way that private businesses are measured. If the City of San Jose's Housing Department were funded by Venture Capitalists to house people, they would be deemed a failure and lose future funding.

You, as leaders, have a great role and responsibility to the citizens of San Jose. I hope we can expect better of you in the future.

My concern is for my fellow citizens who are unable to work because their employers have been shutdown due to the current health crisis. I am equally concerned about the small businesses and their owners who have been forced to shut down.

Some of these people will be unable to pay the rent on their apartments and/or places of business. If they own a home they may not be able to pay the mortgage or the property tax. If there is a moratorium it will protect them from eviction until the crisis ends.

Property taxes are another issue. This health crisis is expected to last around a year. I would like to see a suspension of property taxes for the period of unemployment resulting from this health crisis.

We need strategies now to address the ongoing environmental impacts of homeless encampments and growing concerns associated with these issues while the City finds ways to provide housing to our unsheltered population. It is imperative that local agencies stop pointing fingers and collaborate and work diligently to monitor air and water quality standards and enforce standards and regulations to keep everyone safe. We need policymakers with insight on potential, proactive alternatives. California has a reputation for proposing ambitious environmental policies and San Jose needs to act as a leader.

We need immediate action. Providing trash bags and waste containers for the homeless has not been an adequate solution. Many calls and visits have been made by Homeless Concerns and yet no change, only an increase of debris, fires, graffiti, and encampments. Our creeks and surrounding areas are a disgrace and source of anger and discomfort to residents.

We need immediate proactive solutions to mitigate the negative, environmental consequences to public safety and provide meaningful services to homelessness. The city needs to provide daily, continuous trash, and debris clean up from our creek and surrounding areas to keep our neighborhood clean and safe. That does not involve moving homeless or any human contact, just a visit.
