



Key Messages

- Too much information
- Not enough time
- Need more specifics on how funds will be distributed
- More specificity on vulnerable populations
- Ensure coordination with County, don't duplicate

Coronavirus Relief Funds: Supplemental Memo

Workforce Development Program

\$2,479,500

- Partnership with Goodwill & Foundation for CA Community Colleges
- Training, paid work experience
- Wrap around services (childcare, transportation, rental assistance)

Additional Community Outreach Resident Assistance \$2,000,000

- Options include:
 - Rental Assistance
 - Childcare
 - Utility bills
 - other CRF eligible assistance

Resident Assistance Allocation Recommendations

- □ Allocate \$2,479,500 to fund a job training and subsidized employment program through work2future, including wrap-around services such as childcare
- ☐ Adopt a resolution authorizing the City Manager to negotiate and execute the following grant agreements in the amount of \$19,008,000, including any amendments and revisions with:
 - 1. Sacred Heart Community Services in an amount not to exceed \$7.5 million...
 - 2. Enterprise Foundation, through its Small Business Development Center program, in an amount not to exceed \$3.8 million...
 - 3. Center for Cultural Innovation in an amount not to exceed \$208,000...
 - 4. First 5 Santa Clara County in an amount not to exceed \$2.5 million...
 - 5. Silicon Valley Community Foundation in an amount not to exceed \$5 million...
- □ Direct the City Manager to conduct additional community outreach regarding the remaining Resident Assistance funding in the amount of \$2,000,000.
