### **Background of Events**


#### **Timeline**

- Aug 16 SCU Lightning Complex begins, with multiple fires. Fires have since merged into two major fires broken into three zones
- Aug 19 First evacuation orders issued in Santa Clara County, which do not include any areas of San José
- Aug 22 Red Flag Warning issued based on possibility of dry lightning and gusty winds; Red Flag Warning cancelled on Aug 24
- Aug 25 Fire 15% contained as of 7:00am

**Locations** – Counties of Santa Clara, Alameda, Contra Costa, San Joaquin, Stanislaus, Merced and San Benito

Resource Availability – Heavy fire activity has strained resource availability across California (96% of Cal Fire's engines currently engaged as of Aug 24)





### **SCU Lightning Complex - Week Ahead**

Status	Fire is still active; 15% contained as of Aug 25
	Continued improvement of control lines; Some areas east of Highway 101 changed from evacuation orders to warnings on 8/24
Outlook	CalFire emphasizes that fire control is a "Marathon." Ongoing operations.
	No San José residents received notices or are expected to within next week
City Response	Fire Department has deployed >10 assets for local coverage and support
	Continued coordination with SCU Incident Command Complex

# **State Legislative Update** Eviction Moratoriums

#### AB 1436 (Chiu) - Senate Floor

- Eviction moratorium through state of emergency + 90 days or April 1, 2021.
- Renters have 15 months or April 1, 2022 to pay rent.
- 1 year forbearance for small landlords, 6 months for large landlords.

#### SB 939 (Wiener) - Died

- Temporary commercial eviction moratorium
- 12 month repayment
