# Background & Timeline

- **February 2020** – NSE approved a hybrid operation model for PAL
- **March 2020** – COVID-19 Shelter in place began, operations closed at PAL
- **May 2020** – PRNS staff restarted partnership discussions
- **July 2020**
  - Parks Division reorganization created a Sports Complex Management team that focuses on field & facility management
  - Recreation Program Specialist assigned to PAL
  - Programming discussions define hybrid model coordination

# PAL – A Community Resource during SIP

- **Verily Testing Site:**  
May – July 2020 provided free drive through covid testing
- **Food Distribution:**  
49er Kendrick Bourne/TAP Foundation event (6,000 meals at 3 locations);  
Discussing possible 2<sup>nd</sup> event
- **Potential Fall Programming:**  
Considering drive-in movie nights  
and opening for field use by sports camps



# Hybrid Model:

- PRNS Key/Lead operator
- City on PAL BOD
- PAL - program partner, fundraiser, community connections
- PRNS to provide maintenance and limited financial support
- PRNS & PAL collaborate to offer complimentary programming
- PRNS & PAL partner with Police Dept. for participation in all programming, events and activities



## PAL Operated Programs

- Conducts community relations, fundraising, sponsors
- Primary contact for PD coordination
- Programs league and tournament use of fields
- Operates Tae Kwon Do and gym programs
- Operates concession stands
- Daily minor facility maintenance

## PRNS Operated Programs

- Provides staff support to programs and board development
- Program sports classes and events
- Program community events and activities
- Coordinate with additional food vendors and nonprofit partners
- Conduct daily field maintenance
- Manage major capital projects

# Objectives:

- Rebuild the PAL board, establish new by-laws and standards
- Implement additional PRNS sports and recreation programming and events
- Partner with the Police Department to provide officer participation in all programming and activities conducted at PAL
- Establish a joint workplan for programs and facility projects

# Challenges:

- Closure due to COVID-19
  - Minimal opportunity to operate programming and coordinate with PD
  - Major Capital Projects are on hold due to essential construction needs

# Next Steps:

- Review plan and expected terms with Council later in fall 2020
- Revise contract with PAL nonprofit to reflect the changes to the operational model
- Present again to the Neighborhood Services & Education Committee in winter 2021



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
