Recreation Center were outlined, as was Library Virtual Programming, Summer Meals and providing resources for families and childcare providers impacted by COVID-19. SJPL School Programs were discussed along with a preview of virtual programs to be provided in Fall 2020. Digital access and student and teacher support were discussed.

<u>Public Comments</u>: (1) Paul Soto thanked staff for the work provided and offered his own perspective and observations on the needs of the community. (2) Blair Beekman commented on the vaccine process, future conditions as a result of COVID-19, and loan forgiveness

Staff, including Director of Parks, Recreation and Neighborhood Services, John Cicirelli, responded to an array of questions regarding interpretation of data, scholarship participation, senior services, overcoming the digital divide, access to hot spots and targeting hard-to-reach populations.

Councilmember Sylvia Arenas had questions regarding child care strategies, family resource centers, recreation and library programs and services and noted she would like to receive ongoing and timely information so she may reach out to families through neighborhood associations and other community portals.

<u>Action</u>: Upon motion by Councilmember Pam Foley, seconded by Councilmember Sylvia Arenas and carried unanimously, the update on Summer 2020 programming and a preview of Fall 2020 programs with a focus on opportunities for children and youth was accepted. (4-0-1. Absent: Jimenez.)
