Santa Clara County moves to Orange Tier of State Framework

Gyms and fitness centers max 25% capacity	Movie theaters max 25% capacity or 100, whichever is fewer
Family entertainment centers max 25% capacity	Places of worship max 25% capacity or 100, whichever is fewer
Indoor dining max 25% capacity or 100 people, whichever is fewer	> Wineries max 25% capacity

Santa Clara County entered the Orange Tier of the State's COVID-19 Framework on Oct. 13, and the local Revised Risk Reduction Order took effect on Oct. 14th, allowing additional businesses and activities to resume indoor operations.

This includes restaurants, bars, wineries, gatherings, and non-essential offices.

For more details about what is allowed under the Revised Order, see the Order itself, the Executive Summary, or the press release from last week when the Revised Order was announced. There are also new mandatory directives related to Dining and Gatherings as part of the Revised Order.

Business Tax Financial Hardship Exemption extended in San Jose

For both existing and new businesses, the City of San Jose offers a Financial Hardship Exemption Program.

Financial hardship exemption is granted based on the poverty level guidelines instituted by the Federal Government. The exemption is designed to help businesses owned by sole proprietors in the City of San José whose business income is at or falls below two times the poverty level income established by the United States Department of Health and Human Services.

If you desire to claim an exemption, please fill out the Business Tax Exemption form along with the Business Tax Registration Form and submit the forms with your payment.

To see a list of exemptions, please refer to Municipal Code 4.76.6 or to the Business Tax Exemption Form. If you are registering a new business, apply for the financial hardship

exemption when you apply for your business tax account.

Restaurants - Now FOG Compliance is Easier with SwiftComply



The City of San José is dedicated to providing innovative ways to help businesses thrive while also ensuring the health of customers and the environment.

With those goals in mind, the Environmental Services Department is offering a free ongoing, online service for managing and reporting grease control device pump-outs that allows restaurants to demonstrate compliance without an inperson inspection.

After an initial launch of the program in September 2019, more

than 200 facilities have already signed up to use the online compliance solution that simplifies maintenance records retention and allows businesses to remotely demonstrate compliance with section 15.14.650 of the San José Municipal Code.

New \$14M EV Charging Station Incentive Project Launches in San José



San José Clean Energy has partnered with the California Energy Commission's California Electric Vehicle Infrastructure Project (CALeVIP) to offer \$14 million in incentive funding to increase electric vehicle (EV) charging stations in our city.

Starting December 16, 2020, businesses, commercial property owners, and multifamily residences in San José can apply for significant rebates on eligible Level 2 and DC Fast charging equipment and installation costs.

The project will fund approximately 1,400 Level 2 connectors and 100 DC Fast chargers in San José. At least 25% of incentive funds will be distributed to installations in low-income and disadvantaged communities to further improve access to this infrastructure and move the needle on EV adoption.


