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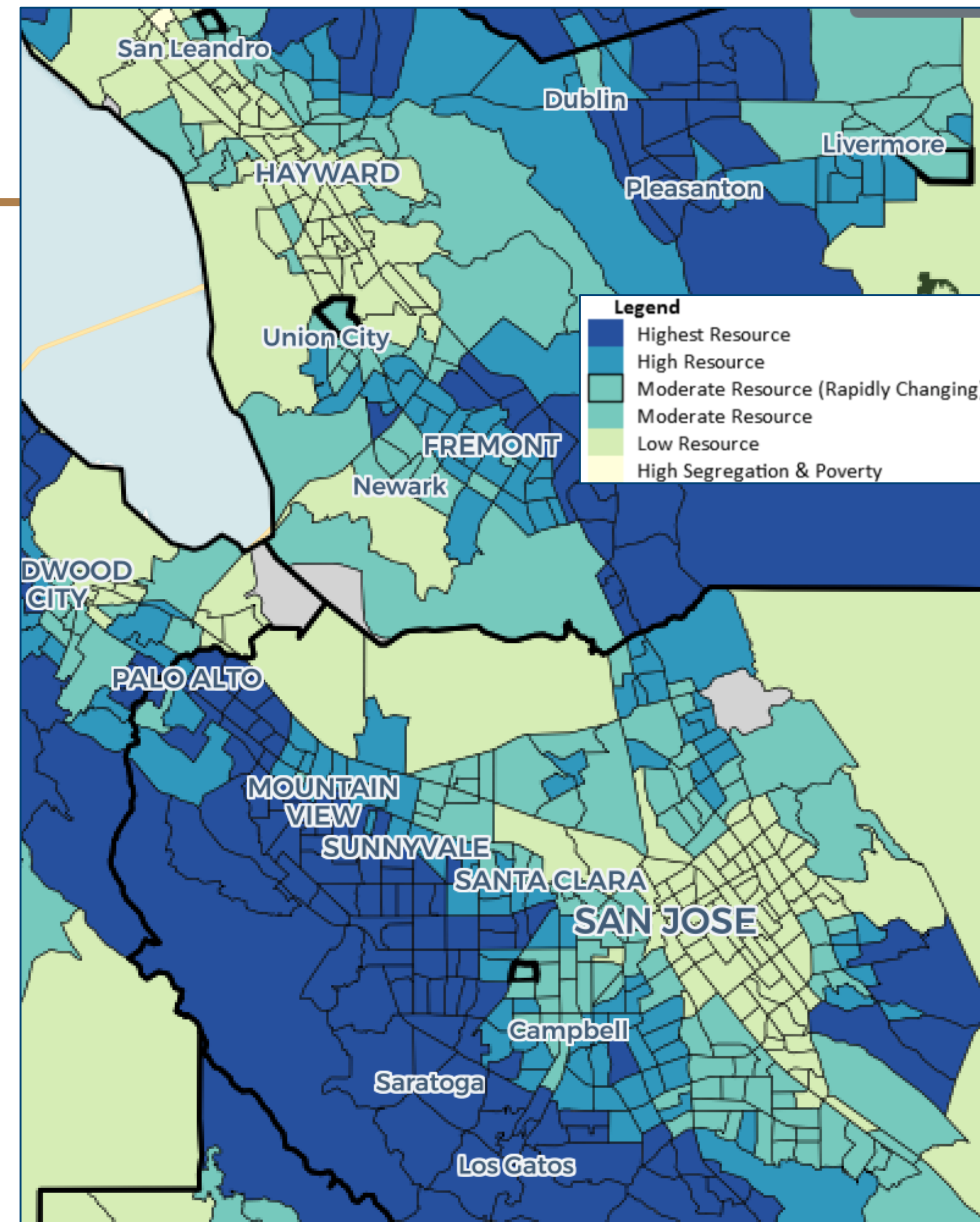
Siting Policy Goals

- Affirmatively further fair housing (AFFH) consistent with Federal and California fair housing laws
- Limiting the development in lower income neighborhoods
- Mitigating residential displacement
- Increasing affordable housing in higher-opportunity neighborhoods of choice

Findings From Review of Evidence

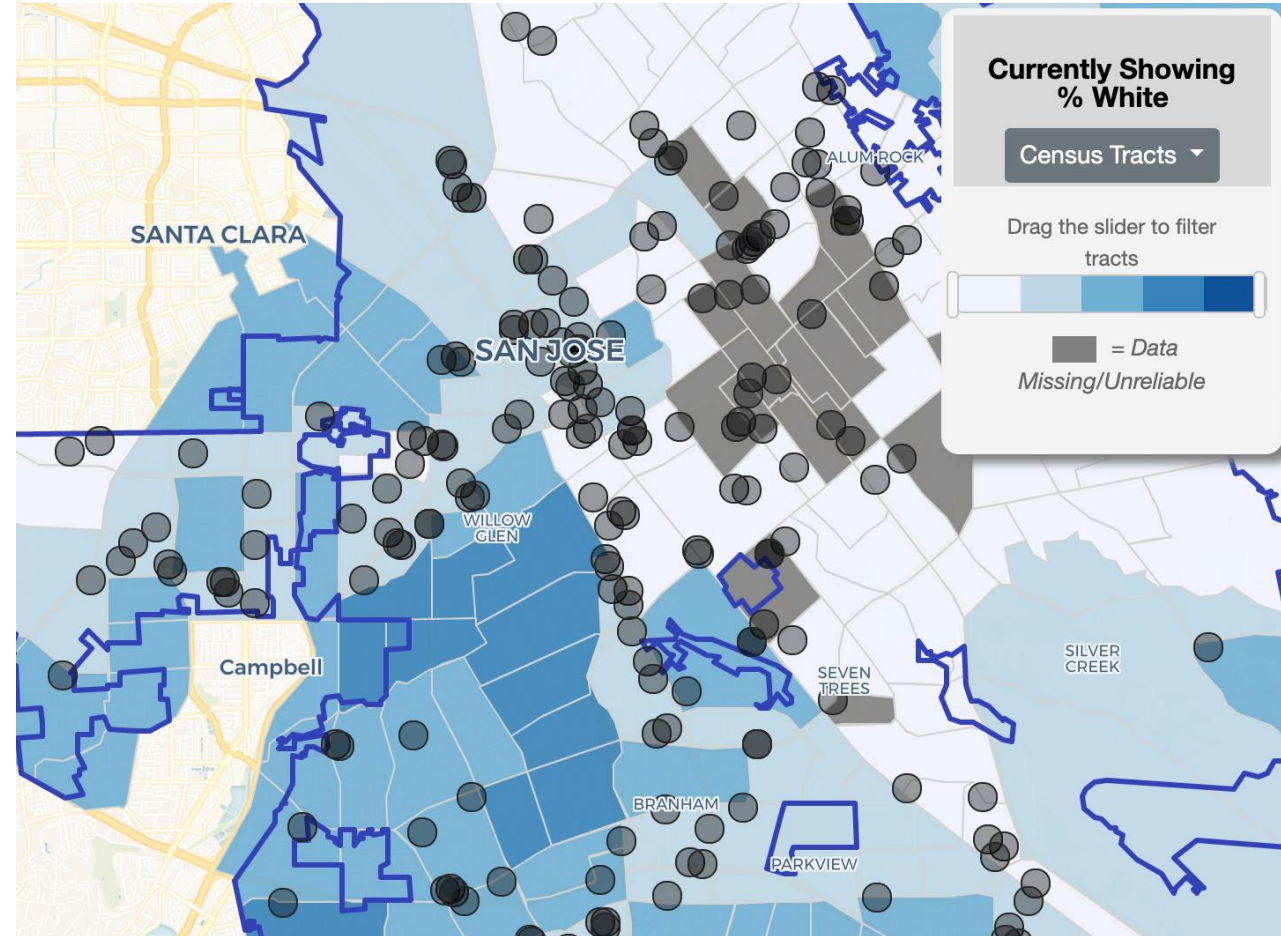
- Neighborhoods have profound impacts on life outcomes
- Access to opportunity-rich neighborhoods varies by race/ethnicity and income
- Affordable housing is typically concentrated in lower resource neighborhoods
- Ending place-based disparities requires a “both/and” approach

Findings From Review of Other Cities

- Only three cities in the review were found to have quantitative AFFH siting priorities
 - Albuquerque
 - Austin
 - Washington DC
- These three cities provide useful models but none appear to have established quantitative siting priorities based on the type of analysis that will be completed for San Jose

Spatial Demographic & Housing Patterns

- Collected and displayed spatial data on demographics, housing problems, and current & future housing stock
- Next step: assess how these spatial patterns align with neighborhood opportunity
