2020 Fireworks Campaign

Carried over successes of the "Fed Up With Fireworks" campaign

- Banners at City facilities
- Highway billboards
- VTA advertisements

Created additional outreach/education videos – using the reporting tool (English/Spanish/Vietnamese)

Expanded stakeholder outreach & increased public safety presence in hotspots

Campaign summary provided to Neighborhood Commission October 14, 2020 – not actionable







Outcomes/Highlights

- Reporting Tool: 335 actionable reports (161 in 2019) | 6,601 total reports
- Unprecedented fireworks use and increased 911 calls for service
- Fireworks Related: 54 Fires (15 in 2019) | 2 Medical Emergencies
- Data inspired decisions, outreach and community contacts
- Enforcement actions:
 - Neighborhood presence by Police and Fire Departments
 - 3 Arrests (2 in 2019)
 - 1 Field Citation (1 in 2019)
 - 4 Online Citations (7 in 2019)
 - 331 Warnings (150 in 2019)
 - Confiscated 425 lbs. of Fireworks (300 lbs. in 2019)





Lessons Learned

Online Reporting Tool High percentage with **Insufficient/No Information**, customer and staff recommendations for additional improvements

Public Safety PresenceLack of public safetypresence to deter illegal activity a concern,appropriate authority required for enforcement

Public Education and Outreach Effective messaging is critical. Outreach through partnership delivers a consistent message to a broader audience

Actionable Reporting Results Significant amount of data collected in 2020, more focus is needed on information/evidence to make a report actionable

Consequences Citation/fines does not appear to be an effective deterrent



Next Steps



- Refine and refresh messaging campaign to capture broad community interest and compel safe celebrations.
- Provide public education "how to" for reporting of illegal fireworks and on City illegal fireworks abatement activities.



• Evaluate and improve reporting tool to improve accessibility and ease of use, increase the number of actionable reports and decrease insufficient evidence and incomplete reports, and if possible, integrate with new version of MySanJose App.



- Perform comparative analysis of illegal fine amounts across the Bay Area and comparable California cities.
- Engage regional partners to leverage illegal fireworks mitigation resources and programs.
- Police Department deployment plan and enforcement.
