## Analysis

The Administration recommends that this proposal receive a Yellow Light; however, staff will reach out to Rick Doyle's family to discuss options, and based on the outcome of that conversation may return with an amended Green Light recommendation if a naming opportunity can be identified that will not require extensive staff work. The Yellow Light recommendation is based on a finding of medium complexity, as outlined above. The proposal would require coordination across multiple departments to identify a suitable facility. Appropriate outreach would need to be conducted once the facility is identified. Per Council Policy 7-5, the naming or renaming of a City facility would need to be considered by the appropriate Commission or Council Committee at a public hearing and ultimately approved by the City Council. Staff would prepare a memorandum for consideration by the Commission or Council Committee and the City Council. Given the work involved and the fact that it is not already part of staff's work plan, staff recommends that it be referred to the Priority Setting Process, pending a discussion with Rick Doyle's family, as mentioned above.
