A thank you, that in the least, we now have, a raise in human consciousness, and more factual reporting, from the Google search engine.

Despite this current grim news, I am still hoping, there can be a way, we can all, more openly talk about, the current state of this pandemic, and it's long term planning ideas.

By late last summer, in the demands of freedom and commerce, I feel plans were created, for an expected rise, in cases this fall, in the hope, that actual deaths, could be kept, to a minimum.

As the effects, of several new vaccines, can begin to do, its important work.

And in the hope, the vaccine process, can more fully establish itself, by next summer, and in the next few years.

Although it seems, we may have, a vaccination process, developing, in different parts of the world, at this time, with the intention, to lessen the intensity, of what seems, the many variations, Covid-19,

We are still seeing, a significant rise, in new cases, at this time, that can cause much harm, if not addressed, with safety and caution.

A rise in cases, that I feel, may end, the planned re-openings, of the January - June 2021 school year.
