#### RE: Item 3.1 - JPA-issued Bonds for Moderate-Income Housing.

Dear Mayor Liccardo, Vice-Mayor Jones, Councilmembers, Jimenez, Peralez, Diep, Carrasco, Davis, Esparza, Arenas, Foley, and Khamis.

On behalf of the Silicon Valley Leadership Group I am pleased to convey our support for the thoughtful approach in a memo co-authored by Mayor Liccardo, Councilmembers Diep, Foley, and Khamis on a framework for how the City can partner with Joint Powers Authorities such as CalCHA and CSCDA to encourage the production, protection and preservation of Low- and Moderate-Income housing. Now, more than ever we need innovative solutions to drive housing affordability for all.

In 2019 the City reported creating zero deed-restricted moderate income housing units for the current Regional Housing Needs Assessment Cycle (RHNA). A middle-income housing program is desperately needed. The memo from the Mayor and councilmembers outlines key protections for taxpayers and affordability for San Jose residents. These are requirements that will allow the City to move forward expeditiously without draining resources from other priorities. We appreciate the input of staff and other stakeholders, but we should be clear that longer delays will result in missed opportunities to create moderate income deed-restricted housing in San Jose.

Programs put forth from CalCHA and CSCDA would utilize revenues generated from the sale of governmental revenue bonds to fully finance new construction of deed-restricted affordable housing targeting the missing-middle, as well as the acquisition and conversion of existing market-rate apartment communities to rent-restricted housing for households earning between 60% and 120% of area median income. These assets, once paid off would revert to City control and even deeper affordability levels can be put in place at that time.

We need to add another tool to the City's housing toolbox that will provide housing for essential workers like nurses, teachers, first responders, librarians, and social workers – each of whom earn too much to qualify for traditional affordable housing programs, yet increasingly not enough to live within the communities they serve. We believe the City setting reasonable criteria and moving expeditiously to partner with JPA's will result in needed affordability for San Jose Residents.
