I interact with families and talk to kids and youth almost every day. I cry thinking about those families in need especially for those who are single parents. I was once a single parent with 4 kids in desperate need of help when hard times came. Pueblo De Dios community members gave me that help and encouraged me to do the same for others. Now more than ever we are experience hard ships and many families in our community need our help in this critical time.

It is not my intention to make you seem careless or unknowledgeable with the situation in the community. The work that you and your staff do for this community are with good intention and is greatly appreciated.

As a member of this community I want to express my concern about the SJC and PRN project decision. I do believe that this plan was made with good intention, however many people in the community believe it is not the best choice. I understand and I'm aware that no matter how much we try to please the people there is always someone who will not be satisfied. Our focus in the community should be education and a safe environment for our neighborhood. Many families from this community that I have talk, strongly believe that having a completely open space in this area will increase crimes, vandalism, alcohol, and drugs use. This community has enough of that going on already, so why increase that? A perfect example is Starbird Park which has an open space and last year, the community asked/signed a petition to fence around the park because of vandalism, alcohol and drug use. 




The youth are the most vulnerable and can be manipulated by those who simply do not care about our future generations. The open space will allow for criminals to take advantage with whatever they chose to do because there will be no supervision. Families houses behind and next to of the area will be exposed to this danger as well. I believe strongly that expending and modifying the Pueblo Playground with some PRN ideas and as well including the restoration of the building 3257 Payne Ave as a community center would be beneficial. Allowing a group of faith and a group of the community to work together and the used the location for their activities. With these activities there will be more respect and consideration for the area. Also, this will prevent our youth and kids from getting exposed to the wrong environment.

PRN said that there is a need for a parking lot for the community garden; I believe the small office structure next to the building can be removed and used for that purpose. PRN took pictures, evaluated and research the historical and sentimental values of the 80 years old House that is now used and hopefully stay in use as a Mandarin Preschool. Yet the 35 years old Church building was not evaluated with the same interests. I ask my self Why? The building is abandoned and getting destroyed by homeless that are looking for place to stay. Leaving the inside with water so it can get mold and more destroyed by it self. I have pass by and it's sad knowing that not to long ago people used this place with no issues of dangers. This building was and still is a second home to many families. It was a place that allowed many families to feel safe and secure. We saw our kids grow up to turn into good citizens with the influence of this building and community.





Now that schools are closed many students from this community are struggling with their grades including my Godson and many other kids that I have spoken to parents about. Due to the current situation of Covid-19 many youths find themselves having to play the role of caregiver while their parents are working or in a loud/distracting environment since many are staying home which does not allow them to concentrate in their studies. Having this building as a community center with a couple volunteers following and respecting the new safety protocol, would provide a place where students can concentrate, study, and get help with school.

A group of faith that used to participate with Pueblo the Dios and myself are willing to help and reach out to more families in the community for them to participate in restoration of this building so that the community can have a secure place where they can go and use it as an active community center like it used to be years ago. I ask you all to please give us the opportunity to demonstrate how much we care for this place. Please allow us to work together, with you and PRN to restore and fixing whatever is needed to be fixed. I know that it can be done.
