- 4) The Administration can advocate for funding for urban greening projects and better alignment between existing regional, state, and federal funding sources.
- 5) The City Manager's Office can convene Departments to discuss a coordinated approach to flexibility in grant funding.
- 6) Intergovernmental Relations will add an urban greening policy into the 2021-2022 Legislative Program to seek additional and more flexible funding for urban greening projects.

Items are listed by recommendation number:

- 1) Staff's current focus is to report back to T&E in Spring 2021 regarding which projects from the adopted Green Stormwater Infrastructure Plan can be implemented in near term using the remaining Measure T funds. While other potential regional projects and green street project will be reviewed, staff does not have the capacity to thoroughly evaluate, prioritize, and pursue implementation of a network of streets throughout the City. Layering green streets into the pavement program would also require more staffing and funding resources than currently exist to plan (at least 3 years out), seek funding for, and coordinate implementation of the projects. However, at a limited scale, minor elements of this direction could be folded into grant pursuits, the remaining Measure T funds, and/or the forthcoming Community Forestry Plan (with respect to expanding the tree canopy).
- 2) This recommendation assumes completion of recommendation #1. Once recommendation #1 is complete, this can occur. However, in near term, staff will ensure that the basic urban greening principles are part of regular CIP project development.
- 3) This recommendation assumes completion of recommendation#1. Once recommendation #1 is complete, this can occur. However in near term, staff will ensure that the basic urban greening principles are part of regular planning efforts.
