Council Directives

- 1. EV/Financial counseling workshops
 - Fall 2020
- 2. E-Car share pilot in affordable housing
 - Letter of support for grant proposal
- 3. E-school bus pilot
 - Letter of support for grant proposal
- 4. Green fleet policy & replacement plan
 - To Council Spring 2021
- 5. One-way vehicle- sharing ordinance
 - To Council Spring 2021
- 6. EV car sharing incentives
 - Incorporated into one-way vehicle-sharing proposal

EV Charging


- EV Charge Network Program: 112 ports
 - Happy Hollow Zoo
 - Police Headquarters
 - Mabury Yard
 - South Yard
- CALeVIP
 - \$7 M fast chargers
 - \$4 M Level 2
 - More than 25% in disadvantaged and lowincome communities

Expanding EV Ownership

> Drive Electric

- Discounts up to \$3k
- Combine with local, state & fed incentives= \$13k-\$17k additional savings

Drive Forward

- 65 people attended workshops
- Majority very low-moderate income
- 40% of survey respondents said they were likely to buy an EV

Proposed: One-Way Shared-Vehicles

Authorize DOT Director to:

- 1. Issue permits to park in metered/restricted areas for *up to* 72 hours
 - No Residential Permit Parking zones unless neighborhood opts in
 - Operators must pay meter fee
- Establish terms and conditions for permit
