Analysis

In December 2019, at the direction of City Council and following memos from Councilmembers Khamis and Esparza regarding the "County Implementation of Laura's Law and Enhanced Conservatorships," the Administration added a "Homeless Population Mental Health" policy to the City's Legislative Program that included advocacy for Laura's Law (language included below). The Administration can provide an update on the County's implementation of Assisted Outpatient Treatment and Laura's Law. In addition, the Administration can send a letter to the County reaffirming the City's position.

Legislative Program Language

Homeless Population Mental Health Policies: Work to support legislation and policies that provide more resources for new or enhanced programs that serve to support the severely mentally ill, dually diagnosed and unhoused in Santa Clara County. Coordinate with the County on strategies to enhance staffing levels, including partnerships with local universities to improve the pipeline of mental health professionals. Support Santa Clara County exploration and potential implementation of Laura's Law (Assisted Outpatient Treatment) and enhanced conservatorship policies. Support the expansion of the federal Supplemental Security Income (SSI)/Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI) Outreach, Access, and Recovery (SOAR) program to provide a steady source of income and health insurance for people with mental illness who are experiencing homelessness.
