Why update the Guidelines?

- City Council Priority #19
- Envision San Jose 2040 General Plan Requirement:
 - CD-4.1 Maintain and update design guidelines adopted by the City and abide by them in the development of projects.
- Guidelines are outdated: 1990-1997
- Create consistency and predictability for applicants and public
- Respond to contemporary best practices, newer development types and create higher quality architecture and public realm







Why update the Guidelines?

- Compliance with State Laws:
 - SB 330 (Housing Crisis Act)
 - No residential downzoning or adoption of standards that reduce capacity
 - Newly adopted design standards must be objective for residential projects
- Gov. Code Sec. 65589.5, Updated Housing Accountability Act
 - If consistent with "objective" standards, the City may not reduce density or deny a project unless it finds:
 - A specific adverse impact to public health & safety
 - The impact can't be mitigated in any other way







Where do the updated Standards & Guidelines Apply?

- Citywide, within San José's Urban Growth boundary, except for:
 - Single-family residences;
 - Rehabilitation, modification or adaptive reuse of historic buildings; and
 - Downtown San José, including the Diridon Station Area
- For approved Urban Village Plans, Specific Plans, and North San José, the standards and guidelines within those documents still apply and shall take priority, however
 - If those documents are silent on any specific design components, the design standards and guidelines in the Citywide Design Standards and Guidelines shall apply.







Updated Standards & Guidelines do NOT change...

- Zoning Ordinance
- General Plan land uses, densities or Floor Area Ratio
- Council-approved urban village plans or specific plans
- ADU requirements
- Public safety, homelessness, or affordable housing policies

Planning Commission Recommendation

- January 27, 2021 supported staff recommendation, including clarifications; voted to recommend that the City Council approve the proposed Citywide Design Standards and Guidelines
- Consider the Determination of Consistency with the Envision San Jose 2040 General Plan Final Program Environmental Impact Report (FEIR) and Supplemental EIR Resolution; and
- 2. Adopt a resolution approving the new San José Citywide Design Standards and Guidelines

 - > In response to David Baker Architects comment letter received by staff after Planning Commission hearing
