INVESTIGATIONS OF ALLEGED POLICE MISCONDUCT

March 16, 2021

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DIRECTION

- On August 18, 2020, the City Council directed the IPA and the City Manager to provide specific recommendations for how the IPA could take over investigations of police misconduct, including the following:
 - Reallocating resources to introduce investigatory capacity within the IPA by the conclusion of negotiations
 - Enabling the IPA to make factual findings based on its investigations of misconduct allegations
- On November 18, 2020, the Rules and Open Government Committee directed the IPA and City Manager to develop a workplan, policy formulation, and consideration of budgetary impacts and return to the full Council

WORKPLAN

- Hire a consultant to evaluate if the IPA or an alternative entity (or entities) should be considered for conducting investigations and recommend a model and staffing plan to effectuate the recommendation
- Simultaneously have staff explore alternative options for investigating allegations of misconduct that are independent of the Police Department but within the City Manager's authority
