# **RECOMMENDATION**

Adopt a resolution approving a list of pavement maintenance projects eligible for San Jose's 2021-2022 allocation of the Road Maintenance and Rehabilitation Account (RMRA) funding, which was made available by the approval of Senate Bill No. 1 (SB-1), otherwise known as the Road Repair and Accountability Act of 2017.

#### **OUTCOME**

Approval of this list of projects will make an estimated \$20,286,246 in RMRA (SB-1) funds available to the City for pavement maintenance in the summer of 2022. The funding will be used to preventively maintain or resurface selected streets throughout the City, improving their condition and extending their useful life before more costly treatments, repairs or reconstruction is necessary.

# **BACKGROUND**

On April 28, 2017, Governor Brown signed SB-1, which created the RMRA to address deferred maintenance on the state highway and local streets and roads systems. SB-1 requires the City to meet specific reporting and accountability requirements established by the California Transportation Commission (CTC). To receive the Fiscal Year 2021-2022 RMRA funds, the City must submit a City Council-approved list of projects (streets) to the CTC by May 1, 2021.

In February 2021, the Department of Transportation (DOT) released its 3-year Pavement Maintenance Plan (2021-2023) to preserve and rehabilitate streets Citywide. DOT coordinated this plan with other City Departments, external stakeholders that work on City streets, City Council Offices, and the Mayor's Office. The list of streets in the Attachment is consistent with

the 3-year Pavement Maintenance Plan, however, it may change if unforeseen circumstances arise or new information regarding other street-related projects becomes available. Per the CTC guidelines, the actual projects completed may differ from the original list submitted.

# **ANALYSIS**

The City is projected to receive approximately \$20.3 million in RMRA funds that will serve as one of the several funding sources making up the estimated \$95.3 million of pavement maintenance funding in Fiscal Year 2021-2022. This total level of funding will allow for maintenance on both the Major Street Network and the Local and Neighborhood Street Network in 2022. Although DOT may utilize RMRA funds on both street networks, DOT is providing the CTC with a list of streets on the Major Street Network in the interest of efficient and simplified reporting.

DOT utilized information provided by the City's Pavement Management System to generate a candidate list of streets for pavement maintenance in 2022 using RMRA funds. The candidate list was then thoroughly analyzed by staff using the following criteria to create the list of recommended streets for submission to the CTC:

- Funding availability and funding use restrictions
- Streets not affected by current or future street related projects
- Maintenance history and prescribed treatment schedules
- Streets associated with planned safety, bikeway or other "complete streets" projects
- Community and City Council office feedback regarding roadway conditions and priority street segments
- Relative location of street segments to create multiple, continuous segments, consistency within neighborhoods, and project efficiency
- Multi-year geographic spread across the City and street network

RMRA funds are being used to support pavement maintenance activities on the Major Street Network. While equity was not specifically considered in the development of the major streets included in the Attachment, similar to the efforts initiated this year with the Local and Neighborhood Streets program, DOT intends to include an assessment of selected streets relative to census tracts designated by the Municipal Transportation Commission (MTC) as "Communities of Concern" in future development of the Major Streets program.

The proposed list of streets in the Attachment is consistent with DOT's current 3-year Pavement Maintenance Plan; however, is subject to change due to unforeseen decreases in funding, private development activity, or construction conflicts. DOT will provide a final comprehensive list of

streets highlighting 2022 projects and an updated 3-year Pavement Maintenance Plan (2022-2024) in an information memorandum to the City Council in early 2022.

# **CONCLUSION**

Staff recommends that the City Council adopt a resolution approving the list of streets described in the Attachment for Fiscal Year 2021-2022 RMRA fund eligibility.

# **EVALUATION AND FOLLOW-UP**

As required by the CTC guidelines, DOT will submit the City Council-approved list of projects (streets) identified for RMRA funding to the CTC no later than May 1, 2021. DOT will also submit a "Completed and In-Progress Project Expenditure Report" for Fiscal Year 2021-2022 to the CTC no later than October 1, 2022. In this report, DOT will describe each project location, funds expended, completion date and estimated useful life among other data points. No City Council action is anticipated for this requirement.

DOT provides an ongoing evaluation of the City's pavement conditions and provides periodic reports on this topic to the Transportation and Environment Committee and the City Council. As stated previously, DOT will provide the City Council an information memorandum in early 2022 that will include a full list of streets to be maintained in 2022 using all available pavement maintenance funds, along with an updated 3-year Pavement Maintenance Plan (2022-2024).

#### **CLIMATE SMART SAN JOSE**

The recommendation in this memo aligns with one or more Climate Smart San José energy, water, or mobility goals.

# **PUBLIC OUTREACH**

This memorandum will be posted on the City's Council Agenda website for the April 13, 2021 Council Meeting.

#### **Description of Project:**

**Street Resurfacing:** Projects that may consist of removal of failed top layer of asphalt, cold-in place recycling, overlay with hot-mix asphalt or rubberized hot-mix asphalt, striping and bike lane enhancements, and Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) curb ramp upgrades

**Street Sealing:** Projects that may consist of removal of failed areas of asphalt, application of a thin layer of emulsified asphalt mixture to protect streets from water penetration and provide a new wearing surface, striping and bike lane enhancements, and ADA curb ramp upgrades.
