SUBJECT: APPROVAL OF MENTAL HEALTH AWARENESS MONTH COMMUNITY EVENT SPONSORED BY COUNCIL DISTRICT 8 AS A CITY COUNCIL SPONSORED SPECIAL EVENT TO EXPEND CITY FUNDS AND ACCEPT DONATIONS OF MATERIALS AND SERVICES FOR THE EVENT

RECOMMENDATION

- 1. Approve May 2021 as Mental Health Awareness Month to be recognized by the City Council on Tuesday, May 11, 2021 as a City Council sponsored Special Event and approve the expenditure of funds.
- 2. Approve and accept donations from various individuals, businesses or community groups to support the event.
- 3. Place the item on the Tuesday, May 11, 2021 Council Agenda for action.

BACKGROUND

On February 1, 2005, the City Council adopted Resolution 72517 which requires Councilmembers to submit a memorandum to the Rules Committee regarding proposed City Council sponsored Special Events and the proposed use of any funds.

Mental Health Awareness Month will be recognized on Tuesday, May 11, 2021 and sponsored by Councilmember Arenas. This special event recognizes May 2021 as Mental Health Awareness Month, which is an annual campaign to raise awareness and reduce the stigma around about mental health, educate the public about strategies for wellness, and advocate for policies that support people with mental illness and their families. Mental Health Awareness Month began in 1949 and was started by Mental Health America. This year, the National Alliance on Mental Health chose the theme, You Are Not Alone to focus on the healing value of connecting in safe ways, prioritizing mental health, and acknowledging that it's okay to not be okay. The event is free and open to the public and will follow all appropriate local public health rules, including requiring masks and social distancing.
