# Political Reform Act

- Regulates State and Local Campaign Committees
- Reporting Requirements
- Disclaimers on Advertisements

# Municipal Code Title 12

- Incorporates Political Reform Act
- Contribution Limit
- Temporal Limit
- Debt Retirement and Surplus Funds
- Additional Reporting
- Disclaimers

# Contribution Limit

- \$600 for Council
- \$1,300 for Mayor
  - Adjusts with inflation, subject to Council approval
- No limit on personal funds
  - Except candidate may not loan more than \$20,000 at any given time

# Other Contribution Limit

- Fundraising begins 180 days before election
- No post-election fundraising unless election contest or recount
- No Officeholder Accounts
- Limits on transfer between campaign funds

# Debt Retirement/Surplus Funds

- Debt Must be retired within 180 days of election
- Use of Surplus Funds Regulated
  - May be returned to contributors
  - Turned over to General Fund
  - Used to pay for election contest or recounts

# Reporting

- Additional pre-election statement due the day before the election
- Disclosure of post-election payments agreements
- Disclosure of source of personal funds
- No anonymous contributions
- Independent Committees must report a copy of printed electioneering communication or transcript of spoken communication

# Independent Expenditure Disclaimers

- Disclaimers on printed “electioneering communications” sent within 90 days of an election

Notice to Voters  
(Required by the City of San José)

This electioneering communication is not authorized or approved by any candidate for city office or by any election official. It is paid for by  
(committee name and committee identification number).

(Address, city, state).

Total cost of this mailing is (amount).

- Disclaimers on spoken form communications must have “paid for by” disclaimer



# Enforcement

- Board of Fair Campaign and Political Practices
- Investigates complaints of local campaign laws through Independent Evaluator
- May reprimand, levy fines, or require correction action
