



# **2020 National Data Analysis**US Deaths in 2020 (% Change from 2019)

San José, CA	<b>▼</b> -18% (60 → 49)		
Los Angeles, CA	<b>▼</b> -3% (246 → 238)		
San Francisco, CA	No change (29)		
Austin, TX	<b>▲</b> +2% (86 → 88)		
Portland, OR	<b>▲</b> +8% (50 → 54)		
New York, NY	<b>△</b> +12% (218 → 243)

Fatal + Severe Injuries (KSI) ▼ -9%


Fatalities ▼ -18%

Fatalities caused by Speeding ▲ +117%




## 2020 Traffic Fatalities: by month





#### **Cumulative KSI by Month**









# **Traffic Fatalities**2016-2020 by Street User Type

#### **Traffic Fatalities by Street User Type (2016-2020)**








### Speeding, Red Light Running: Top 2 Known KSI Factors



- 2020 Primary Factor Speeding is 3 times Red Light Running in KSI
- Traffic fatalities caused by Speeding more than doubled from 2019




<u>Preliminary Near Miss Insights from Meridian Ave and W San Carlos St</u> Almost 50% of near miss events are on south leg

- 60% involve vehicles going northbound
- 83% involve peds outside crosswalk

## 3. Strategize Traffic Enforcement

#### AB 43 (Friedman) – Traffic Safety

 Flexibility to lower the speed limit on high injury and fatality streets and vulnerable populations including children, seniors, people with disabilities, and people experiencing homelessness

#### AB 550 (Chiu) – Speed Safety System Pilot Program

- Allows large cities to pilot Speed Safety Systems (7/1/22 1/1/27)
- Near a school, senior zone, public park, recreational center, or on a street within a high injury network
- Requirements on equity, privacy issues, facial recognition ban
- Fine (\$50-\$500) based on speed exceeded, no points
- Allowable uses of revenue include traffic calming and threshold metrics requirements to enable continued operation of the Systems



## 4. Increase Community Outreach

- Strategic Communications RFP Council Award to MIG anticipated in June 2021
- Safety Outreach in 8 locations by Fehrs & Peers (OTS Grant)
- 3. Campaigns on Priority Safety Corridors:
  - "Look Out When It's Dark Out" Posters
  - "Slow Down" Changeable Message Boards
- 4. Increasing Vision Zero coordination: County (TSCN), Region (MTC), State (CaCTI)


