On February 1, 2005, the City Council adopted Resolution 72517 which requires Councilmembers to submit a memorandum to the Rules Committee regarding proposed City Council sponsored Special Events and the proposed use of any funds.

In the midst of a difficult year of pain and fear, we reflect on the tradition of leadership, resilience, and courage shown by AANHPI communities, and recommit to the struggle for AANHPI equity.

In lieu of City Proclamation Affordable Housing Month by the City Council on Tuesday, May 18th, 2021 and is sponsored by Councilmember Magdalena Carrasco This Month brings awareness and reactive community engagement opportunities, in a time when the importance of a secure, safe, and affordable home has become even more crucial.

ANALYSIS
