Economic Development Director Kim Walesh presented highlights of the latest edition of the SJ Economy E newsletter, including: the hosting of the Silicon Valley Workforce Ecosystem Initiative developed jointly by Netflix, Evergreen Valley College, Area School District and Manufacturing Companies; San Jose Housing work plan update, Wayfinding coming to downtown San Jose, which provides block by block guidance to visitors; Silicon Valley's Foreign Trade Zone-Forum hosted recently by the OED, which helps US companies compete internationally; OED's Field Trip to regional developments projects, as well as VivaCalle's main event scheduled for Sunday May 19, 2019, which is expected to connect events in different parts of the City.
