A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN JOSE AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO NEGOTIATE AND EXECUTE VARIOUS AGREEMENTS AND AMENDMENTS TO AGREEMENTS, AND TO ACCEPT GRANT FUNDS FOR PARKS, RECREATION AND NEIGHBORHOOD SERVICES PROGRAMS; AND AUTHORIZING THE DIRECTOR OF PARKS. **RECREATION AND NEIGHBORHOOD SERVICES TO** NEGOTIATE AND EXECUTE VARIOUS AGREEMENTS AMENDMENTS AND то AGREEMENTS. WHEREAS, the City of San José ("City") contracts with community-based organizations, school districts, and other parties for various programs administered by the Department of Parks, Recreation and Neighborhood Services to support the livability of neighborhoods, offer opportunities for individuals to enjoy life, and strengthen communities of people within San José; and

WHEREAS, in order to expedite the City's contracting process and to make funding available to the recipients promptly, and in the interest of saving administrative time and cost, the City Council ("Council") desires to authorize the City Manager to negotiate and execute certain agreements and amendments to agreements and to accept grant funds for Parks, Recreation and Neighborhood Services programs, and to authorize the Director of Parks, Recreation and Neighborhood Services to negotiate and execute certain other agreements and amendments to agreements, all in amounts consistent with the City's final adopted budget for Fiscal Year 2021-2022, and subject to appropriation of funds; and

WHEREAS, the proposed agreements to implement these various programs and the corresponding compensation paid to the City for Fiscal Year 2021-2022 are listed in Attachment A to this Resolution; and

WHEREAS, the proposed agreements for which authority is to be delegated to the Director of Parks, Recreation and Neighborhood Services and the corresponding compensation amounts for Fiscal Year 2021-2022 are listed in Attachment B to this Resolution; and

WHEREAS, the proposed agreements to implement these various programs and the corresponding compensation to be paid by the City for Fiscal Year 2021-2022 are listed in Attachment B to this Resolution; and

WHEREAS, in the event that the final budget adopted by Council for Fiscal Year 2021-2022 specifies amounts for these agreements that differ from those listed in Attachments A and B, the final budget amounts for Fiscal Year 2021-2022 will control the actual amounts for these agreements;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN JOSE THAT:

Subject to the appropriation of funds by the City Council, and on such terms and conditions as deemed appropriate by the City Manager:

 a) The City Manager is hereby authorized to negotiate and execute all agreements, amendments, and extensions to accept funds for the Department of Parks, Recreation and Neighborhood Services identified in the "Compensation Paid to the City of San José" (Attachment A);

- b) The City Manager is hereby authorized to accept any funds exceeding the figures identified in Attachment A for the specified programs and purposes identified as "Compensation Paid to the City of San José," provided that the City Manager determines that the City is able to provide the services and comply with any additional requirements associated with the increased grant funds. The City Manager shall also bring forward to City Council any items that require approval for budgetary adjustments and appropriation actions necessary for such programs; and
- c) The Director of Parks, Recreation and Neighborhood Services is hereby authorized to apply for, accept, negotiate and execute 2021-2022 agreements and amendments as identified in "Delegation of Contract Authority to Department of Parks, Recreation and Neighborhood Services Director" (Attachment B) consistent with Adopted Budget amounts for the following City programs or services:
