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A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN JOSE APPROVING THE BUDGET REPORT OF THE DOWNTOWN BUSINESS IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT FOR FISCAL YEAR 2021-2022, LEVYING ASSESSMENTS IN THE BID FOR FISCAL YEAR 2021-2022, AND SUSPENDING THE COLLECTION OF ASSESSMENTS FOR BUSINESSES THAT QUALIFY FOR THE BUSINESS TAX FINANCIAL HARDSHIP EXEMPTIONS UNDER THE CITY'S GENERAL BUSINESS TAX ORDINANCE

**WHEREAS,** the City Council of the City of San José established the Downtown Business Improvement District ("BID") pursuant to Ordinance No. 22960 dated October 20, 1988, pursuant to the California Parking and Business Improvement Area Law, California Streets and Highway Code §36500 *et seq.* ("Improvement Law"); and

**WHEREAS,** under and pursuant to the Improvement Law, on June 15, 2021 the Council adopted Resolution No. 80067, a resolution declaring the Council's intention to levy the assessments for Fiscal Year 2021-2022 in the BID; and

**WHEREAS,** said Resolution No. 80067 was duly published, as provided by the Improvement Law; and

WHEREAS, as specified in Resolution No. 80067, a public hearing concerning the levy of assessments for Fiscal Year 2021-2022, including a clarification of the existing Apartments/Hotels category for residential landlords leasing 1 and 2 units so that these landlords of 1 and 2 units will pay \$150 while residential landlords of 3 or more units will continue to pay \$264, and the suspension of the collection of assessments for businesses that qualify for the business tax financial hardship exemptions under the City's General Business Tax Ordinance was held before the Council on June 29, 2021, at the meeting beginning at the hour of 11:00 a.m. (to be heard no sooner than 1:30 p.m.) in the Council Chambers of the City of San José, 200 East Santa Clara Street,

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San José, California, or by teleconference that is open to the public and enables public

comment; and

WHEREAS, \_\_ written protests against the levy of assessments or against any

will be benefited by the expenditure of the funds raised by the assessments or

charges proposed to be levied.

4. The levying of assessments in the BID for Fiscal Year 2021-2022 in accordance

with this Resolution is hereby authorized.
