Dear San José,

This Tuesday, Aug 31st, the Sunnyvale City Council will be deciding whether or not to continue the temporary lane closure pathway on Tasman Drive.

Tasman Drive is a street in North Sunnyvale with 2 lanes of car traffic in each direction and a light rail line that goes through the center, but there are no continuous sidewalks or bike facilities on either side of the street between Fair Oaks Ave and Lawrence Expressway.

The pandemic greatly reduced traffic on Tasman Dr, and at the urging of local advocates, in September 2020 the City of Sunnyvale temporarily closed a vehicle lane on the South side of Tasman Drive to provide space for walking and biking. Over the last few months, there has been incredibly high usage of the lane closure pathway. Residents have been using it to travel to parks, buy groceries, commute to work, and walk their dogs.

Currently, the city is studying how to make this lane closure pathway permanent and exploring doing a similar one on the Westbound side of the street (<u>DPW 21-03</u>). The temporary lane closure pathway should stay until the study is complete and a permanent lane closure pathway is built.

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Dear City Council,

I'm glad you're studying reforming how much parking San Jose requires to be built. We do need REDUCED parking requirements

But I OPPOSE efforts to eliminate all parking requirements. Elimination of parking requirements is likely to mean that housing built for under-\$80,000-a-year people will not have parking. This is ok for units within easy walk of train stations (say, 600 yards).

But I support "missing middle" housing in much of the rest of San Jose, comparable to the housing that is being routinely built in greater Seattle, greater Boston, and greater Denver. It is not burdensome to include a parking space with such housing.

And I have been impressed with the work of the Rocky Mountain Institute that shows that with the great work of the San Jose area's electric car industry, permitting the associated level of automobile use is completely consistent with achieving all international climate goals.

Trying to 'discourage' the working class and the average teacher from having one car in the family by making it unaffordable will not be productive.

I'll be following this policy in the coming months as it makes its way to you for a vote. I urge you to take a strong stance in favor of appropriate regulation that will benefit EVERYONE in San Jose. .



I recently had to pay \$1,400 to fix up my car! Public transit is important because its costs can be more equitable and predictable. As we discuss parking in San Jose, please prioritize public transit over individualized car-based infrastructure. I want to one day (soon!) stop relying on my car, so please don't require so much parking to be built. Instead, support building more housing and improving public transit.

There are lots of really good reasons to support changing these requirements:

- 1. parking spaces take up a lot of land in our community
- 2. parking encourages driving, which causes more congestion, pollution & global warming
- 3. instead, we need to emphasize walking & biking to have a healthier community & planet
- 4. public transit is a taxpayer investment, so we should encourage its usage over private cars
- 5. excess parking takes away from the amount of crucial housing we need to build
- 6. excess parking takes away from community benefits like active ground floor space for restaurants or shops
- 7. parking garages in new housing are so expensive the costs are passed on to residents, which is unfair to those who don't have a car
- 8. paying for parking is a burden that hits lower-income folks hardest
- 9. parking requirements don't make sense because there are already San Jose buildings with unused parking spaces
- 10. parking lots & garages are often unattractive, so who wants to look at more of them?

I'll be following this policy in the coming months as it makes its way to you for a vote. I urge you to take a strong stance in favor of forward-thinking reforms.

Hello,

I'm writing to please be added to the City Council Docket at your earliest convenience.

I have been in financial hardship ever since March 2020 when the eviction moratoriums began and I was taken advantage of by 5 tenants who never provided me or my management with any paperwork proving they were affected by COVID-19.

I've lost over \$160k in income since March 2020 and my bills for the property total \$165k/year. I am suffering.

I am now dealing with sidewalk and tree notices from the City.

After what I've gone through, this is adding salt to my wounds.

I do not know how I will pay for the work for the two notices I received because I'm still paying for the damages (2 floods-water left on by tenants who weren't paying rent for several months on 2nd floor and damage to their apartments and the ones below them), and I've liquidated most of my retirement just to keep my building afloat. I pay all utilities, water, garbage, landscaping, cleaning of common areas, etc. for my building. I have had to borrow money to keep the building afloat and to survive.

I won't be "in the black" again for another 4-5 years because of what has happened.

I was "in the black" (\$16-22k/year) from day one of owning my building after over 35 years of hard work to purchase my first building in 2005 and then 1031 exchange it into my current building in 2016.

To top it all off, the SJPD wasn't willing to help me when there was a huge homeless encampment under the freeway near my property and homeless were hanging out on my property, littering, peeing and leaving excrement all over my property. They were hanging out on my front porch like it was their own.

I would like to go before the City Council with my story and I am seeking a waiver on the fees for my sidewalk and tree removal invoices. In normal pre covid times, I would have been able to cover these costs, but I can't now.
