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PRE-COVID – Housing Department conducted encampment abatements and outreach.

June 2020 – Emergency Operations Center Beautify SJ Branch activated. Encampment abatements shift to management.

October 2020 – Bi-weekly trash and hygiene services starts.

March 2021 – Council directs priority abatements around schools and in public right of ways.

June 2021 – Approved budget allocated \$11 Million in American Rescue Plan for a consolidated model in PRNS



ILLEGAL DUMPING IN 2021 BY SERVICE REQUESTS & POUNDS COLLECTED





Public Right-of-Ways School Buffer Zone of 150 Feet


