

Process for Final Report

By Friday, November 19th EOD, Commissioners will receive a draft of final recommendations (including minority report) for review.

To avoid serial meetings and therefore a Brown Act violation, Commissioners may meet in subcommittees and provide one redlined document for each subcommittee to Consultant by EOD Wednesday, November 24th. Redlined documents must be provided with all edits in track changes. Subcommittees are requested to focus their edits on their subcommittee's recommendations, but may also provide feedback on other recommendations.

Consultant will aggregate feedback and share a full draft report with revised recommendations (and minority report) with Commissioners by 9am on Monday, November 29th. Wherever possible, Commissioners are encouraged to book some time to read the report on Monday before the meeting.

During the Commission's final meeting at 5:30pm on Monday, November 29th, the consultant will review, in light of the edit suggestions, the report. The Chair will take a final vote on approving the full draft report. A final vote tally on the full report will be included in the final report, along with the vote tallies for each of the recommendations that were voted on by the Commission.

After the final Commission meeting, the Consultant and City Clerk staff will prepare the final report for electronic signature on Friday, December 3rd, after which the final approved report will be posted publicly as part of Council's December 14th meeting agenda. The Chair reserves the right to make technical revisions to the final report as the City staff deem necessary.

Once the report is posted, the Charter Review Commission will be considered disbanded, and therefore no longer bound by the Brown Act. If requested by the City Council through staff, the Chair may be asked to present the final report to Council on December 14th.
