Background

On June 22, 2021, the City Council established the Reimagining Public Safety Community Advisory Committee. The Committee was given scope to bring forward recommendations to the Council in the following areas:

- Alternatives to Policing
- Transformation of Police Policies and Practices
- Increased Police Accountability and Transparency to the Public
- Implementation Strategies

Process Highlights

- A total of six members who live within Gang Hot Spots or Project Hope neighborhoods have been seated on the committee.
 - Members appointed by community organizations represent the following neighborhoods:
 - Washington/Alma
 - 10th and Williams Street
 - Julian Street
 - Three additional members have been recruited by staff from the following neighborhoods to bring the total to six:
 - Cadillac Winchester
 - Santee/Phelan
 - Valley Palms/San José Apartments
- The Committee has formed a Steering Committee and Policy Committees.

Purpose

We are here to engage in a community-led process that we believe can lead to meaningful recommendations for reform and alternatives to policing in our community.
