2.7 22-1617 Amendment to the Airline-Airport Lease and Operating Agreement with Airlines Operating at the Airport.

Adopt a resolution authorizing the Director of Aviation to negotiate and execute an amendment for the Airline-Airport Lease and Operating Agreement with any current or new passenger or cargo airlines at the Norman Y. Mineta San José International Airport. CEQA: Not a Project, File No. PP17-003, Agreements/Contracts (New or Amended) resulting in no physical changes to the environment. (Airport)

2.8 22-1618 Continuation of Drought Declaration.

Adopt a resolution extending the drought emergency in Resolution No. 80303 through May 31, 2024, continuing the declaration of a water shortage of 15% citywide and limiting the use of potable water for landscape and turf irrigation to two scheduled days per week, except when watering by hand or by drip irrigation, or for maintenance of public parks, playing fields, day care centers, golf course greens, and school grounds, provided such irrigation is done in a water efficient manner, or for fire protection, soil erosion control, plants and trees grown for consumption, nursery or garden center plants for sale, and environmental mitigation projects. CEQA: Categorically Exempt, File No. ER21-266, CEQA Guidelines Section 15308, Actions by Regulatory Agencies for Protection of the Environment. (Environmental Services)

2.9 **22-1619** Actions Related to Continued Shelter Crisis to Activate Two Overnight Warming Locations During the Cold Weather Season.

(a) Adopt a resolution declaring the continued existence of a shelter crisis in the City of San José pursuant to, and in accordance with, the provisions of California Government Code section 8698 et seq., and designating the following two Cityowned facilities to be occupied as Overnight Warming Locations by individuals experiencing homelessness during the cold weather season: (1) Roosevelt Community Center; 901 E Santa Clara Street, San José, CA 95116; and (2) West Valley Branch Library; 1243 San Tomas Aquino Road, San José, CA 95117. (b) Adopt a resolution authorizing the Director of Housing to negotiate and execute an agreement with HomeFirst, retroactive to October 15, 2022, through June 30, 2023, in an amount not to exceed \$900,000 to implement the Overnight Warming Locations. CEQA: Categorically Exempt, File No. ER22-243, CEQA Guidelines Sections 15269, Emergency Projects, and Section 15301, Existing Facilities. Council Districts 1 and 3. (Housing/Library/Parks, Recreation and Neighborhood Services)

2.10 22-1677 Request for Travel Authorization for Councilmember Jimenez.

As recommended by the Rules and Open Government Committee on November 2, 2022, authorize travel for Councilmember Jimenez to Cape Town, South Africa from February 20, 2023 to February 24, 2023 to attend the Sister Cities International African Regional Summit (Source of Funds: District 2 Funds). As recommended by the Rules and Open Government Committee on November 2, 2022: (a) Retroactively approve the Movie Nights and Jazz Concerts at Cahill Park, the Municipal Rose Garden, and Rosemary Gardens Park scheduled on July 23, 2022, August 6, 2022, August 13, 2022, August 27, 2022 and October 1, 2022, as City Council sponsored Special Events and approve the expenditure of funds; and (b) Approve and accept donations from various individuals, businesses, or community groups to support the event. CEQA: Not a Project, File No. PP17-011, Temporary Special Events resulting in no changes to the physical environment. (Davis) [Rules Committee referral 11/2/2022 - Item B.1]

3.1 Report of the City Manager, Jennifer Maguire (Verbal Report)

City Manager Jennifer Maguire provided a verbal report on the recent visit by United Nations High Commissioner Filippo Grandi, who leads the international response to refugee crisis around the world and works to create inclusive and supportive environments for refugees. Due to this visit the City Manager's Office of Racial Equity could consider new and innovative ways to address needs of refugees in the City of San José.

3.3 22-1620 Financial Need-Based Stipends for Boards and Commissions.

(a) Approve an ordinance amending Section 2.08.120.A of Title 2 of the San José Municipal Code to provide a monthly \$200 financial need-based stipend to each member of each City board or commission established under Chapter 2.08 of the San José Municipal Code or the City of San José Charter: (1) Who is not currently receiving a stipend; (2) Who is a member of a low-income household as defined by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development as at or below 80 percent of the area median income pursuant to 24 CFR 92.2; (3) If they have attended a monthly board or commission meeting; and (4) Such members shall be eligible to be paid the stipend even if the monthly board or commission meeting is canceled.

(b) Direct the City Clerk's Office to establish the Financial Need-Based Stipend Application process. (c) Direct the City Manager's Office to ensure stipend budgeting and administration are coordinated among City departments. CEQA: Not a Project, File No. PP17-008, General Procedure and Policy Making resulting in no changes to the physical environment. (City Manager)

<u>Public Comments</u>: Blair Beekman; Catalyze SV, Alex Shoor; and Mollie McLeod offered public comments.

3.4 22-1621 Tax Equity and Fiscal Responsibility Act Hearing for California Municipal Finance Authority's Issuance of Tax-Exempt Multifamily Revenue Bonds to Finance the 2350 S. Bascom Affordable Housing Development.

(a) Hold a Tax Equity and Fiscal Responsibility Act of 1982 public hearing for the issuance of not to exceed \$65,000,000 of tax-exempt multifamily housing revenue bonds by the California Municipal Finance Authority, to finance and refinance the acquisition, construction, improvement and equipping of the 123-unit affordable apartment complex to be located at 2350 S. Bascom Road in San José by San José Bascom Associates, L.P., a California limited partnership or an affiliate; and to pay certain expenses incurred in connection with the issuance of the bonds. (b) Adopt a resolution approving the issuance of tax-exempt multifamily housing revenue bonds, by the California Municipal Finance Authority in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$65,000,000 to finance and refinance the acquisition, construction, improvement and equipping of 2350 S. Bascom, and to pay certain expenses incurred in connection with the issuance of the bonds. CEQA: Exempt from CEQA review per Public Resources Code Section 21080(b)(1) and CEQA Guidelines Section 15369, Ministerial Development pursuant to Government Code Section 65913.4, File No. ER20-109. Council District 9. (Finance/Housing)

Vice Mayor Chappie Jones opened the public hearing. There were no public comments. Vice Mayor Chappie Jones closed the public hearing.

3.5 22-1622 Tax Equity and Fiscal Responsibility Act Hearing for California Municipal Finance Authority's Issuance of Tax-Exempt Multifamily Revenue Bonds to Finance the View at Blossom Hill Affordable Housing Development.

(a) Hold a Tax Equity and Fiscal Responsibility Act of 1982 public hearing for the issuance of not to exceed \$95,000,000 of tax-exempt multifamily housing revenue bonds by the California Municipal Finance Authority, to finance and refinance the acquisition, construction, improvement and equipping of the 271-unit multifamily rental housing project to be located at 1007 Blossom Hill Road in San José by View at Blossom Hill, LP, a California limited partnership or an affiliate; and to pay certain expenses incurred in connection with the issuance of the bonds. (b) Adopt a resolution approving the issuance of tax-exempt multifamily housing revenue bonds by the California Municipal Finance Authority, in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$95,000,000 to finance and refinance the acquisition, construction, improvement and equipping of the 271-unit multifamily rental housing project to be located at 1007 Blossom Hill Road in San José, and to pay certain expenses incurred in connection with the issuance of the bonds. CEQA: Categorically Exempt, File No. ER21-078, CEQA Guidelines Section 15332, Infill Development Projects. Council District 9. (Finance/Housing)

(a) Adopt a resolution authorizing the Director of Public Works to: (1) Award and execute the 10201 SJC Airport Accessibility Upgrades Phase 3A - Terminal Buildings Re-Bid Project to the lowest responsive bidder in an amount not to exceed \$14,000,000; and (2) Approve a contingency in the amount of 15 percent of the contract amount. (b) Adopt the following 2022-2023 Appropriation Ordinance and Funding Sources Resolution Amendments in the Airport Capital Improvement Fund: (1) Increase the estimate for Revenue from Federal Government by \$10,000,000; and (2) Establish the Terminal Accessibility Upgrades appropriation to the Airport Department in the amount of \$10,000,000. CEQA: Determination of Consistency with the Final Environmental Impact Report for the Norman Y. Mineta San José International Airport; and (3) Decide any timely bid protest(s) and make the City's final determination as to the lowest responsive bidder that is responsible as needed to award the Contract. (Resolution No. 79497), File No. ER22-262. (Public Works/ Airport/ City Manager)

Action: (a) **Resolution No. 80754**, (b) Appropriation **Ordinance No. 30845** and Funding Sources **Resolution No. 80755** were adopted. (9-0-2. Absent: Peralez, Liccardo.)

8.1 22-1625 Approve the Santa Clara Valley Transportation Authority License Agreement for the Safe Parking Program.

(a) Adopt a resolution adopting the addendum to the Incidental Safe Parking Use Municipal Code Amendments Negative Declaration, all in accordance with the California Environmental Quality Act, as amended. (b) Approve a License Agreement with the Santa Clara Valley Transportation Authority for recreational vehicles safe parking at the Santa Teresa Light Rail Station, north parking lot, for a four-year term. CEQA: Addendum to the Incidental Safe Parking Use Municipal Code Amendments Project Negative Declaration (Resolution No. 78990), File No. ER22-220. Council District 10. (Housing)

Open Forum

- 1. Blair Beekman spoke on the election process and expressed frustration on the inability to provide public comments for closed session items or for the City Manager's report.
- 2. Paul Soto spoke on the demolition of the previous San Jose City Hall building and spoke to the historical importance of the building for Civil Rights in San Jose.
- 3. Cindy Fulk expressed frustration on the drawn-out abatement processes within Richard Huerta Park, a park that was dedicated to a fallen San Jose Police Department police officer. Cindy expressed that delaying the process was disrespecting the police department and officer, as the location is an honorary park.
- 4. Caller with number ending in -6910 spoke on buffer zones and how they stigmatize unhoused persons. They questioned whether current city policy language should be changed and spoke to the danger of pushing unhoused persons further away from safe areas towards higher traffic areas.
- 5. Jill Borders thanked Councilmember Foley for the community events put on by the district, commentingthat they are wholesome, inspiring and motivating. The caller said the events gave them hope and that the council district should be proud.
