<u>Documents Filed</u>: Staff presentation entitled, "Smart Cities & Service Improvements Committee: IT Strategic Plan", (Rob Lloyd, IT), dated March 1 2018.

Deputy City Manager Kip Harkness and Chief Information Officer Rob Lloyd offered the Strategic Plan and responded to questions.

Councilmember Dev Davis sought clarifications on budget and a sense of what percentage the I.T. Department will be asking for this year.

Mayor Sam Liccardo joined the meeting at approximately 2:05 pm

Councilmember Chappie Jones appraised the project's effectiveness to recruit people with project management backgrounds that would impact the project's success rate.

Staff will come back in April to the Committee with a conversation on privacy policy.

<u>Public Comment</u>: Blair Beekman offered comments on privacy policy and the need for community involvement in civil protections and civil rights issues associated with the technology. Dr. Roxanna Marachi (Researcher and Education Chair of the Silicon Valley, NAACP) spoke to the intersections of technology, progress, privacy, and expressed concerns about harm to communities of color and the likely disenfranchising of already disenfranchised communities.

<u>Action</u>: Upon motion by Councilmember Lan Diep, seconded by Councilmember Dev Davis, and carried unanimously, the Committee accepted the report. (4-0. Absent: Khamis)

<u>Public Comment</u>: Victor Sin (Chair of the Santa Clara County Chapter of the ACLU of Northern California) urged the Committee to develop and enact a robust and comprehensive surveillance technology ordinance before deploying any technology that can collect data on and monitor residents. Blair Beekman commented on the human and civil rights of everyday people in the data collection process. Dr. Roxanna Marachi, (Researcher and Education Chair of the Silicon Valley, NAACP), addressed data ethics canvas process, Hadoop data security, and a halt to vote on this until there is a full and thorough confirmation that security data gaps are addressed and closed.
