(1) Verbal Report on Economic Development Activities. (Economic Development).

<u>Documents Filed</u>: Provide a brief summary of recent announcements, significant accomplishments, and upcoming events related to economic development.

Deputy City Manager Kim Walesh presented highlights of the latest edition of the SJ Economy E newsletter including, among other features: The naming once again of the San José Area Economy as number 1 strongest economy in the U.S., per Business Insider data; the Downtown San Jose Retail Strategy progress report, a guest blogpost article by Emily McGrath, (Next Flex Deputy Director of Workforce Development); article on startup Farm-ecology in San José, (an innovative 14,000 square foot industrial facility that grows microgreens such as Lettuce, Kale and Arugula); a summary of the Hammer Theater Center's progress report towards new operational model, an article about Prospect Silicon Valley which focuses on robotic electric vehicle charging technology, as well as the Mobility, Energy and Environment Symposium that the City and Prospect Silicon Valley held in the Rotunda, which attracted over 220 people and showcased electric vehicle and other technologies.
