Comply with the State of California's apprenticeship program requirement that at least 16.7% of the hours worked by their respective constmction workforces on the project must be worked by registered apprentices from approved apprenticeship training programs with proper payment of wages and fringe benefits as required by law, and,

ii. Ensure that 25% of those registered apprentices are identified as having an employment barrier such as homeless, veterans, or at-risk youth.
