2. Criteria for the Review of Drive-Through Uses (Rocha) That the Rules Committee add the following proposal to the next workload priority setting session: Direct staff to review the setback criteria contained in Section VII of Council Policy 6-10 (entitled "Criteria for the Review of Drive-Through Uses"). Staff should evaluate whether it still makes sense to allow some drive-through projects to be built without any setback from residential, while requiring other drive-through projects to abide by a 200-foot setback requirement.
