City Attorney Deputy City Attorney Mark Vanni gave an update on SB 970 and provided the Elections Update of the what the City Council put forward in the November ballot, Measures G and H, as well as elections for Districts 4 and 6. He noted that the Board's Title 12 recommendations were provided to the Rules and Open Government Committee in February, and provided an explanation on the San Jose Notice to Voters as campaign guidance update.

Board Member Louis Silver asked if there were significant opposition to the two ballot measures, Deputy City Attorney Mark Vanni answered ballot arguments in support were submitted by the City Council while no arguments were submitted against.

Vice Chair Chris Peacock stated he took issue with the op ed piece written by Chair Gonzales and published on San Jose Spotlight on July 24. Mr. Peacock indicated his belief that the letter was not in keeping with the Board as a model of fair and ethical conduct and consequently tendered his resignation effective at the end of the meeting. Board Members Joe Lopez and Louis Silver expressed their opinions about the opinion piece. Chair Adrian Gonzales cited his reasoning for submitting the opinon piece, indicating his desire to align with a number of community members and some council members.

<u>Action</u>: Upon motion by Board Member Louis Silver, seconded by Board Member Joe Lopez and carried unanimously, it was agreed that Deputy City Attorney Mark Vanni would give a presentation regarding the proposed ballot measure at the next meeting.
