Partnering with PG&E:

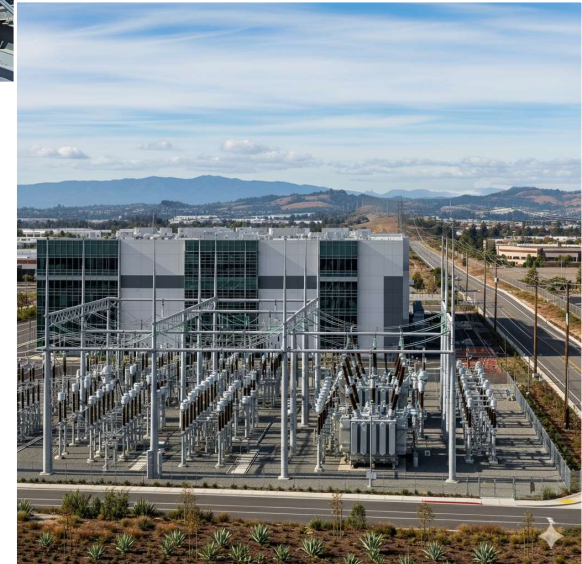
In partnership with PG&E, the City is advancing initiatives to support electrification, streamline permitting, and enhance energy infrastructure.

Since our last update, we...

- Advanced Shared Permit Status Dashboard and Annual Permit expansion pilot with PG&E
- Executed and publicized City of San Jose - PG&E Implementation Agreement
- Developed shared Large-Load Customers database for tracking PG&E performance obligations.
- Launched Data Center Development Team (internal working group)
- Closed RFQ for RWF 159 Acres Economic Dev Lands

Diridon Station Modernization:

- Acceptance of configuration for the station and program of inter-related projects
- Hired consultants to begin the state and federal environmental review process
- Advertised a Project Director role for the Diridon Station Program



Electric Vehicle Charging Infrastructure:

- Finalized site selection and achieved 60% progress on San José Clean Energy's Direct Current Fast Charging Hub Pilot contract negotiation
 - Affordable and reliable fast charging hubs at six City-owned properties.
- Reached out to all awardees of the CEC REACH 3.0 grant to inform them of incentive stacking through San José Clean Energy's Multifamily EV Charger Incentive Program, which has a fiscal year goal of installing 240 ports at 20 properties.
- Reached out to industry groups to inform future charging programs as part of the 5-year refresh of the San José Clean Energy Programs Roadmap.
