Project Scope

- Extend Light Rail from South of Alum Rock Station to Eastridge
- Aerial Guideway in median of Capitol Expressway
- 2.4 Miles Long
- Minor Roadway Widening
- Construct Two Stations Story Road and Eastridge
- Construct Pedestrian Overcrossing at Story Station
- Construct Two Traction Power Substations
- Relocate Major Utilities (Completed)





Construction Status

- Over one mile of bridge structure complete
- Foundation pile driving is complete
- Bridge construction at Ocala, Cunningham and Story intersections underway
- About 50% of the project is complete
- Project in a dense urban area with several challenges
- Project complete in end of 2027







Work along Capitol Avenue

- Roadway widening is complete
- Tail tracks have been removed south of Wilbur Avenue
- Bridge foundation work completed along Capitol Avenue
- Foundation type changed to minimize noise and vibration
- Residents and businesses notified of construction activities





Activities next 6 months

Story Road to Wilbur Avenue

- · Foundation and bridge construction
- Traffic lane closure during off peak hours

Story, Ocala and Cunningham Intersections

- Construct bridge structure over the intersection
- · Occasional traffic detour at night
- · Story station structure at Story Road

Story to Ocala Avenue

- · Trackwork over the bridge
- Drainage work under the bridge

Ocala Avenue to Eastridge

- Complete remaining bridge section
- Trackwork over the bridge









Traffic Mitigation & Safety

- Recruitment of off-duty police officers
- Extensive planning including real time monitoring of traffic
- Regular traffic advisories related to project
- Working with City of San Jose on traffic calming on side streets
- Speed limit is 35 MPH
- Crossing guards at Ocala



Environmental Mitigation

- Project committed planting 249 trees within 2-mile radius
- VTA's partnering with Our City Forest
- Free trees for residents who are interested
- We have found homes for 70 trees on the east side of San José
- We are ahead of plan to meet our commitment to plant 249 trees by the end of the project




