SUBJECT: Report on the Request for Proposal for the Fire Department's

Emergency Medical Advisor Services

RECOMMENDATION

- (a) Accept the Fire Department's report on the Request for Proposal for Emergency Medical Advisor Services, with optional Registered Nurse Consultant Services.
- (b) Adopt a resolution authorizing the City Manager, or her designee, to:
 - (1) Negotiate and execute an agreement with Stanford Health Care to provide emergency medical advisor services for an initial three-year term beginning December 1, 2025, through November 30, 2028, for a maximum compensation not to exceed \$510,000 for the initial term, subject to the appropriation of funds;
 - (2) Negotiate and execute amendments as required to add, delete, or modify services to address seasonal variations, budgetary constraints, or unanticipated changes in demand, subject to the appropriation of funds; and
 - (3) Exercise up to two one-year options to extend the term of the agreement through January 1, 2030, subject to the appropriation of funds.

SUMMARY AND OUTCOME

Approval of this recommendation will provide the continuity of the required emergency medical advisor services for the Fire Department (Department). These services, along with the option to provide on-site emergency medical Registered Nurse services,

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provide representation, clinical subject matter expertise, and medical oversight for the Department's Emergency Medical Services.

BACKGROUND

The Department's Bureau of Emergency Medical Services and Training – Emergency Medical Services Division is responsible for the administration of personnel that deliver pre-hospital emergency medical services to people who live, work, and visit the City of San José (City).

Within the Emergency Medical Services Division, the Medical Advisor provides representation, clinical subject matter expertise, and medical oversight for Advanced Life Support, Basic Life Support, Emergency Medical Dispatch Priority Reference System, and the Weapons of Mass Destruction programs.

The last Request for Proposal (RFP) for Emergency Medical Services Advisor consultant services was conducted in 2020. Stanford Health Care was awarded a one year contract with two additional one-year options. Additionally, the contract also received several extensions in anticipation of issuing a new RFP.

In September 2025, the City issued an RFP for these services, the results of which are detailed in the analysis section below.

ANALYSIS

On September 5, 2025, the City released a new RFP for emergency Medical Advisor consultant services (with the option for a Registered Nurse) through the City's e-procurement system (Biddingo). The RFP was downloaded by 14 unique companies, and ultimately, the City received two proposals. The RFP closed on September 26, 2025.

Evaluation Process

The proposals were evaluated and scored independently by a three-member evaluation team consisting of sworn personnel from the Department. The expense and time required to conduct oral interviews, along with the scores, were considered and oral interviews were deemed unnecessary. The evaluation scores are summarized below:

Protest

The RFP process included a 10-day protest period that commenced when the City issued the Notice of Intended Award on October 14, 2025. No protests were received.

Award Recommendation

The evaluation panel used the criteria established within the RFP. Upon conclusion of the review process, the panel recommended to award Stanford Health Care.

EVALUATION AND FOLLOW-UP

No additional follow-up needs to be provided on this item, and no additional evaluation will be conducted.

COST SUMMARY/IMPLICATIONS

1. AMOUNT RECOMMENDATION (Three-Year Initial Term): \$510,000

2. SOURCE OF FUNDING: General Fund

3. FISCAL IMPACT: Funding for medical advisor services in the amount of \$165,000 is included within the Department's 2025-2026 Adopted Operating Budget. The vendor rates are expected to increase by no more than 3% each year for subsequent years of the initial three-year term. Any adjustments to the funding will be requested through future budget actions.
