Purpose:

This Working Families Power event includes a gathering of elected officials nationwide. Topics for discussion will focus on housing and cost of living, economic and workforce development, wage disparity, and related matters affecting working people. As with study missions and other conferences, this provides an educational opportunity to learn about policy approaches in other jurisdictions as well as a strategic opportunity to collaborate with other elected officials to address shared concerns.

Councilmember Campos is well positioned to represent the City at this convening given her focus on expanding opportunity for working families and addressing housing affordability and cost-of-living challenges in San José. These priorities closely align with the convening's topics, and her participation will support bringing back relevant policy insights to inform Council decision-making and advance equitable outcomes for residents.
