

**MINUTES OF THE
JOINT MEETING OF THE RULES AND OPEN GOVERNMENT COMMITTEE AND
COMMITTEE OF THE WHOLE**

SAN JOSÉ, CALIFORNIA

WEDNESDAY, NOVEMBER 19, 2025

The Committee meeting was held in the Council Chambers and convened at 2:00 p.m.

C. Rules Committee Reviews, Recommendations and Approvals

1. Historic Preservation Ordinance Reform. (Mahan, Foley, Tordillos, Mulcahy, and Cohen)

1. Direct the City Manager to return to City Council by March 2026 with options and analysis for the following:
 - a) Establish an enhanced outreach program for property owners of properties on the Historic Resources Inventory to inform them of relevant historic preservation regulations, including the San José Historic Preservation Ordinance.

b) Establish an amnesty program for unpermitted construction on structures in the historic resources inventory that do not create health and safety hazards.

c) Provide a legal framework for certain structures on the historic inventory to be demolished or removed from the inventory where substandard structures exist and/or where the historic features of the structure are no longer evident.

d) Modernize historic preservation regulations to allow for installation of windows and other building elements that support the City's climate, wildfire, safety, and energy efficiency goals.

2. Conduct analysis on the above in consultation with stakeholders including the Developers Roundtable, the Japantown Community Congress, and the Preservation Action Council of San Jose (PacSJ).

Councilmember Anthony Tordillos introduced the item, bringing forward the recommendation as outlined in the November 13, 2025 joint memorandum co-authored by Mayor Mahan, Vice Mayor Foley, Councilmember Tordillos, Councilmember Mulcahy, and Councilmember Cohen.

Public Comment: None provided.

Action: Upon motion by Councilmember Domingo Candelas, seconded by Councilmember Rosemary Kamei, and carried unanimously, the Historic Preservation Ordinance Reform item was approved to return to the Rules and Open Government Committee in December 2025 with a Workload Analysis. (5-0-0)
