SUBJECT: Report on Bids and Award of Contract for the 10594 – 2026 Local Streets ADA Curb Ramps #2 Project

RECOMMENDATION

- (a) Report on bids and award a contract for the construction of 10594 2026 Local Streets ADA Curb Ramps #2 Project to the lowest responsive, responsible bidder, Spencon Construction, Inc., in the amount of \$1,224,200; and
- (b) Approve a 10% contingency in the amount of \$122,420.

SUMMARY AND OUTCOME

Award of the contract to Spencon Construction, Inc. enables the construction of the 10594 – 2026 Local Streets ADA Curb Ramps #2 Project (Project), which involves upgrading and constructing Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) compliant wheelchair ramps at various locations citywide in preparation for the 2026 Local Streets Pavement Maintenance Program. Approval of the 10% contingency will provide funding for any unanticipated work necessary for the proper completion or construction of the Project.

BACKGROUND

The Department of Transportation will maintain approximately 95 miles of roadway on the Local Streets Network during the 2026 construction season. As part of the annual pavement maintenance program, the Department of Transportation incorporates preventive maintenance treatments, such as surface sealing and resurfacing, to extend pavement life, improve ride quality, and reduce long-term maintenance costs. Per Title 28 Section 35.151 of the Code of Federal Regulations, ADA compliant curb ramp installations and retrofits are typically required when pavement treatments involve

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alterations to the roadways. These curb ramps provide safe and accessible pedestrian crossings for all users, including individuals with disabilities, and ensures that San José's infrastructure meets current accessibility standards.

The ADA curb ramp installation work typically includes removal of existing non-compliant curb ramps or barriers, grading and pouring of new compliant curb ramps, installation of detectable warning surfaces, and restoration of adjacent sidewalk and roadway surfaces.

To develop the curb ramp candidate list, the Department of Transportation utilized data collected in the OpenGov Enterprise Asset Management tool, which tracks curb ramp conditions and compliance status. The candidate list is further refined by staff using the following criteria to select the streets for pavement maintenance and consequently, the curb ramps on those streets:

- Funding availability and funding use restrictions;
- Total miles of streets in different rehabilitation and maintenance categories;
- Streets not affected by current or future street-related projects:
- Maintenance history and prescribed treatment schedules;
- Existing conditions and compliance needs;
- Equity and community needs;
- Community and City Council office feedback regarding roadway conditions and priority street segments; and
- Coordination with other planned or utility projects.

Construction is scheduled to begin in March 2026 with substantial completion anticipated by June 2026.

Attachment A – List of Locations, includes the list of ADA curb ramps proposed for installation or retrofits as part of this Project. This list is subject to change if unforeseen circumstances arise or if new information about other street-related projects become available.

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ANALYSIS

Bid Results

Bids were opened on October 16, 2025, with the following results:

Procurement Issues

The bid from Duran Construction Group, Inc. was deemed non-responsive for failing to meet the City of San José's (City) experience requirements and for failing to submit a California Air Resources Board (CARB) Off-Road Regulation Certificate(s) of Reported Compliance for any designated subcontractor with fleets subject to such regulations.

Since 2008, CARB has regulated certain types of construction vehicles through the In-Use Off-Road Diesel-Fueled Fleets Regulation (Off-Road Regulation). The Off-Road Regulation requires contractors and other fleet owners to reduce their emissions by retiring older vehicles and replacing the retired vehicles with newer vehicles, repowering older engines, or installing verified diesel emission control strategies in older engines; and by restricting the addition of older vehicles to fleets.

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In 2022, CARB approved amendments to the Off-Road Regulation aimed at "[establishing] a proactive check at the onset of a project or at contract renewal to encourage fleets to comply with the regulation...[and] also safeguard against the unfair monetary advantage of non-compliance and thus help level the playing field for all fleets." The amendments, which went into effect January 1, 2024, require public agencies to obtain a valid Off-Road Certificate of Reported Compliance for the fleets and subcontractors that are listed in the contract. The certificates must be obtained by the public agency prior to entering into a public works contract.

In accordance with the Off-Road Regulation, the City has, since January 2024, required that bidders provide CARB compliance documentation with each bid.

On October 22, 2025, the City issued a notice of intent to award notifying Duran Construction Group that its bid was non-responsive and stating the City's intent to award the contract to the lowest responsive, responsible bidder, Spencon Construction, Inc. On October 27, 2025, Duran Construction Group submitted a written protest to the City (Attachment B – Protest Submitted by Duran Construction Group) requesting that the City waive the irregularities in its bid. On October 29, 2025, the City's Public Works Department responded to Duran Construction Group by declining its request and stating that the City would continue to recommend award to Spencon Construction, Inc. (Attachment C – City's Response to Duran Construction Group's Bid Protest).

Bid Price Analysis

The low bid submitted by Spencon Construction, Inc. is 21% below the Engineer's Estimate. The bids are lower than the Engineer's Estimate likely due to competitive contractor pricing and market efficiencies identified.

The Engineer's Estimate was developed using recent bid data from smaller-scale ADA curb ramp projects, as this is the first major curb ramp project undertaken by the team in several years. While this approach provided a basis for estimating, it may have resulted in higher projected cost compared to current market pricing for a larger-scale project.

Staff has determined that the submitted low bid is reasonable and acceptable for the scope of work.

Contractor Prior Experience

Spencon Construction, Inc. has successfully completed numerous ADA curb ramp projects for the City including: 8300 – 2016 ADA Sidewalk Accessibility Ramps Project; 9050 – 2019 Major Streets Concrete and ADA Ramps Project #2; 9951 – 2021 ADA

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Curb Ramp Request Project #2 – Sustainable Mix Design; 10060 – 2022 Major Streets Concrete and ADA Ramp Minor Project #1; 10231 – 2023 MS ADA Ramp Minor Project #2; 10348 – 2024 LS ADA Ramps #1 Project; and 10473 – 2025 LS ADA Ramps #1 Project.

Contingency

San José Municipal Code Section 27.04.050 provides for a standard contingency of 10% on all public works contracts except those involving the renovation of building or buildings. The standard contingency is appropriate for the Project.

Wage Theft Prevention Policy Check

The Department of Public Works' Office of Equality Assurance reviewed bidders for compliance with the City's Wage Theft Prevention Policy on October 16, 2025, and again on October 29, 2025. A wage violation was identified which fell within the policy's five-year enforcement window for the following contractor: Spencon Construction, Inc. However, in accordance with the Wage Theft Prevention Policy, the violation did not meet or exceed the threshold for mandatory disqualification. The bidder was allowed to proceed in the procurement process.

Project Labor Agreement Applicability

The City's Project Labor Agreement is applicable to this Project because at the time of advertisement, the Project Labor Agreement applied to any project with an Engineer's Estimate over \$1.21 million.

Local and Small Business Outreach

Spencon Construction, Inc. is a local and small business enterprise. No subcontractors are listed for the Project.

EVALUATION AND FOLLOW-UP

The Department of Transportation continuously evaluates the condition of San José's pavement and regularly reports its findings to the Transportation and Environment Committee. In addition to the Project discussed in this memorandum, seven additional pavement maintenance projects are scheduled for City Council consideration this spring. These include seven contracts for surface sealing or resurfacing, covering a combined total of approximately 143 miles of streets planned for maintenance in the 2026 construction season.

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Ramps #2 Project

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COST SUMMARY/IMPLICATIONS

This project supports the Transportation and Aviation Services City Service Area goal to provide a safe and secure transportation system that enhances community livability. In compliance with federal ADA requirements, the City must ensure that all ADA curb ramps are upgraded to current standards on streets scheduled for maintenance. The source of funding for this project is included in the 2025-2027 Adopted Biennial Capital Budget in the VTA Measure B Pavement Maintenance Fund (Fund 486). This project will have no net operating and maintenance costs to the General Fund.

Thank you for the opportunity to bid on 10594 - 2026 Local Streets ADA Curb Ramps #2 and for your team's time in reviewing Duran Construction Group's submission. I want to point out other contractors provided bids that did not include CARB Certificate for concrete delivery suppliers and or subcontractors.

STATEMENT OF BIDDER'S EXPERIENCE

The bidder must provide a minimum of three (3) completed projects as references. The completed projects must demonstrate the bidder's experience and ability to complete the construction work as required under the terms of the Contract by meeting the following requirements:

Requirement No. 1: The projects must have involved construction substantially similar to the construction for this Project. "Substantially similar" means the following:

- a. The original contract amount was at least 70% of the engineer's estimate for this Project; and
- b. The projects must have involved the same elements of construction using similar construction trades as this Project.

Requirement No. 2: The substantial completion date for each reference project must have been after January 1, 2018.

Requirement No. 3: Each reference project must have been performed by the bidder or its predecessor in interest. Reference projects completed by a subcontractor or key personnel will not meet these requirements.

SUBJECT: PROTEST OF INTENT TO AWARD BID DOT 10594 – 2026 LOCAL STREETS ADA CURB RAMPS #2 PROJECT

Dear Mr. Duran,

This letter is to inform you that City staff has evaluated your October 27, 2025, letter entitled "Response to Notice of Intent to Award 10594 – 2026 Local Streets ADA Curb Ramps #2," and will be making the following recommendation to the City Council. Pursuant to the San Jose Municipal Code, the City Council has the authority to resolve bid protests made during this procurement.

RECOMMENDATION:

City staff will recommend upholding the intent to award the construction contract to Spencon Construction, Inc.

BACKGROUND:

On October 16, 2025, bids were opened for the DOT 10594: 2026 Local Streets ADA Curb Ramps #2 Project. Eight bids were submitted, with Duran Construction Group submitting the apparent lowest bid (\$1,219,770) and Spencon Construction, Inc. submitting the apparent second lowest bid (\$1,224,200).

After reviewing the bids for responsiveness, the City determined that the bid from Duran Construction Group was non-responsive for failing to meet the City's experience requirements and for failing to provide a California Air Resources Board (CARB) Off-Road Diesel Vehicle Certificate of Reported Compliance for one or more of its designated subcontractors' fleets. On October 22, 2025, the City issued a Notice of Intent to Award the contract to Spencon Construction, Inc., the bidder who submitted the lowest responsive and responsible bid.

SUBJECT: DOT 10594: 2026 Local Streets ADA Curb Ramps #2

PROTEST:

On October 27, 2025, the City received a timely written protest from Duran Construction Group. The protest asserted that the City should waive as a minor irregularity the deficiencies in Duran Construction Group's bid and award the contract to Duran Construction Group.

ANALYSIS: DURAN CONSTRUCTION GROUP'S PROTEST IS BASELESS

A. Duran Construction Group was required to submit three reference projects that met the City's experience requirements and failed to do so

During each public works procurement, bidders are required to complete a Statement of Bidder's Experience form providing information that demonstrates the bidder's experience and ability to complete the project in question. The Statement of Bidder's Experience form provides a list of experience requirements that each bidder must meet. For DOT 10594: 2026 Local Streets ADA Curb Ramps #2, bidders were required to submit three completed projects that met the following requirements:

- 1. The original contract amount was at least <u>70% of the engineer's estimate</u> for this Project.
- 2. The projects must have involved the <u>same elements of construction</u> using similar construction trades as this Project.
- 3. The substantial completion date for each project must have been after January 1, 2018.

The Engineer's Estimate for DOT 10594: 2026 Local Streets ADA Curb Ramps #2, as provided in the Notice to Contractors, was \$1,545,000. As such, bidders were required to submit projects with a contract value of at least \$1,081,500 to meet the City's experience requirements.

Duran Construction Group provided three potential reference projects for consideration, of which only two met the \$1,081,500 contract value threshold. Of those two potential reference projects meeting the contract value threshold, only one can be considered as a completed project. As such, Duran Construction Group provided only one completed reference project that met the City's requirements:

- 1. <u>2024 Reconstruction (Cupertino)</u>: The 2024 Reconstruction Project, completed in July 2025, meets all of the City's experience requirements.
- 2. <u>DOT OP 67100 (San Jose)</u>: An open purchase order does not meet the City's requirement to submit completed *projects* as references. Open purchase orders are not *projects* in and of themselves; they are standing orders for ongoing, recurring work done over a specific time period. As projects arise, a contractor with an open purchase order is dispatched to the site to perform work. While the value of DOT

OP 67100 exceeded the \$1,081,500 contract value threshold, it is unlikely that any single *project* completed pursuant to DOT OP 67100 met that threshold.

3. <u>Concrete Roadway Restoration (Santa Clara County)</u>: The Concrete Roadway Restoration Project, completed in July 2021, does not meet the \$1,081,500 contract value threshold.

In its protest letter, Duran Construction Group offers to provide additional park experience for the City's review. However, accepting substitute projects that were not submitted to us at the time of bid would be inconsistent with the City's practice and contrary to commitment to ensuring a fair, transparent and competitive procurement process.

B. Duran Construction Group was required to submit California Air Resources Board Certificate(s) of Reported Compliance for any designated subcontractor with fleets subject to the In-Use Off-Road Diesel-Fueled Regulations and failed to do so.

The City consistently holds that failing to submit a properly completed bid package is grounds for being considered non-responsive, as permitted by Section 2-1.06 of the City's Standard Specifications.

Since 2008, CARB has regulated certain types of construction vehicles through the In-Use Off-Road Diesel-Fueled Fleets Regulation (Off-Road Regulation). The Off-Road Regulation requires contractors and other fleet owners to reduce their emissions by retiring older vehicles and replacing the retired vehicles with newer vehicles, repowering older engines, or installing verified diesel emission control strategies in older engines; and by restricting the addition of older vehicles to fleets.

In 2022, CARB approved amendments to the Off-Road Regulation aimed at "[establishing] a proactive check at the onset of a project or at contract renewal to encourage fleets to comply with the regulation...[and] also safeguard against the unfair monetary advantage of non-compliance and thus help level the playing field for all fleets.¹" The amendments, which went into effect January 1, 2024, require public agencies to obtain a valid Certificate of Reported Compliance for the fleets and subcontractors that are listed in the contract. The certificates must be obtained by the public agency prior to entering into a public works contract.

In accordance with the Off-Road Regulation, the City has, since January 2024, required that bidders provide CARB compliance documentation with each bid:

- The Notice to Contractors states that bidders must submit valid Off-Road Regulation Certificate(s) or Reported Compliance for their fleet and those of their designated subcontractors.
- A CARB Regulation Compliance form is included in the Request for Bids package.
 Bidders are required to mark two checkboxes: one to indicate whether the bidder's fleet is

subject to the Off-Road Regulation and a second to indicate whether any subcontractor fleets are subject to the Off-Road Regulation. For any fleet that is subject to the Off-Road Regulation, the bidder must submit a valid Off-Road Certificate of Reported Compliance.

In its bid, Duran Construction Group indicated that one or more of its designated subcontractor(s)' fleets are subject to the Off-Road Regulation. However, the company failed to submit an Off-Road Regulation Certificate of Reported Compliance for its only designated subcontractor, Milpitas Materials Co., and instead submitted a Truck and Bus Certificate of Reported Compliance for that company. Given that the City's procurement documents – including the CARB Certificates of Reported Compliance Reminder – clearly require Off-Road Certificates of Reported Compliance and not Truck and Bus Certificates of Reported Compliance, Environmental Systems, Inc.'s bid was deemed non-responsive on the basis that its "CARB Certificate of Reported Compliance is missing or invalid (subcontractor)." This irregularity was noted in the bid results which were posted with the Notice of Intent to Award on October 22, 2025.

Again, in its protest letter, Duran Construction Group offers to correct the deficiency after the fact by providing Milpitas Materials Co.'s Off-Road Regulation Certificate of Reported Compliance. However, accepting documents that were not submitted in a timely manner would be inconsistent with the City's practice and contrary to commitment to ensuring a fair, transparent and competitive procurement process.

As stated above, the City Council has the authority to resolve bid protests made during this procurement. Duran Construction Group will be afforded the opportunity to formally present its case to the City Council when this item is agendized for City Council action. Alternatively, Duran Construction Group may withdraw its protest.
