My name is **Nicole Bodene**, and I am a resident near Fuze Bar & Grill. I am writing to formally oppose the requested permit amendment for Fuze Bar & Grill (Case Nos. CPA16-005-01 & ER25-125), specifically **Point 4**, which proposes removing the existing restriction on amplified music after 10:00 p.m. and extending music hours until 2:00 a.m.

As a resident directly impacted by this establishment, I strongly urge the Council to deny this amendment based on the following:

- Documented Noise Violations: On multiple occasions, music from Fuze Bar & Grill has exceeded 87+ decibels after 10:00 p.m. This is well above acceptable limits under San José Municipal Code Chapter 20.40.600, which restricts noise in residential areas during nighttime hours to protect residents' health and peace. The bass is so strong it causes windows to vibrate in nearby residences, creating a highly disruptive and unhealthy living environment.
- 2. **Family & Child Well-Being:** The excessive noise and inappropriate music directly obstruct my family's ability to enjoy our community spaces. We cannot safely or comfortably be outside with our toddler due to the constant blaring of music—often with lyrics inappropriate for a two-year-old—being blasted into the shared outdoor areas. The **American Academy of Pediatrics** and **EPA noise guidelines** both emphasize that prolonged noise exposure can be harmful to young children, disrupting sleep, learning, and development. Extending music until 2:00 a.m. would only intensify these harms.
- 3. **Community Disruption & Safety Concerns:** The late-night disturbances already attract unsafe behavior around the property. Residents have repeatedly reported issues with loitering, intoxicated patrons, and disorderly conduct, which pose risks to neighborhood safety and are incompatible with maintaining a livable residential environment.
- 4. **Track Record of Non-Compliance:** Fuze Bar & Grill has consistently ignored community complaints and has failed to comply with existing permit conditions. Granting additional privileges despite this pattern undermines the purpose of the City's permitting process and sends the wrong message to other businesses.

For these reasons, it is clear that extending music until 2:00 a.m. would be **devastating for Globe residents** and directly conflict with both **San José's municipal noise regulations** and the City's stated commitments to public health, safety, and family-friendly neighborhoods.

I respectfully request that the City Council **deny the permit amendment in its entirety** and uphold the existing 10:00 p.m. music restriction.

Thank you for your consideration and for prioritizing the well-being of San José families and residents.

I am Ash Ahuja, a resident of Downtown San Jose living of Fuze nightclub. I am writing to strongly oppose the permit request under case numbers CPA16-005-01 & ER25-125, specifically point four regarding the proposed extension of operating hours until 2 AM with blasting music.

Currently, Fuze consistently plays loud music well past their current licensed cutoff of 10 PM, often continuing late into the night, disturbing all nearby residents, including myself. The bass vibrations shake my entire condo windows facing 2nd Street, and it is impossible to open windows for fresh air due to the intolerable noise levels starting early evening and continuing beyond 10 PM today.

Despite numerous complaints delivered directly to Fuze, there has been no mitigation or respect for the community. The music is not just loud but amplified heavily in the brick alleyway between Fuze and residences, exacerbating the disturbance. Allowing them to operate until 2 AM with loud music would only exponentially increase the noise pollution and negatively impact the quality of life for residents who need rest and safety.

Furthermore, the history of Fuze includes ignoring resident concerns and incidents that raise serious safety and community well-being issues. Extending the hours would worsen public safety concerns in the area that already has rising violence linked to such establishments.

For the health, safety, and peace of the Downtown San Jose community, I urge the City Council to deny the request for extended hours and loud music under case numbers CPA16-005-01 & ER25-125.

Thank you for considering the wellbeing of your residents over the interests of one disruptive business.

- Getting adequate rest, especially on weeknights
- Enjoying peaceful use of their homes

Dear Rina Shah,

I would like to take a moment to echo Mr. Kirk Pennington's sentiments regarding Fuze's formal request to extend their outdoor music allowance to 2am. Our community at The 88 strongly opposes their request and we urge city officials to consider our perspective and stance. Before deep diving into the matter, I would like to formally introduce myself. My name is Yama Homayoun and I serve as the Vice President for The 88's HOA. I have lived decade and have witnessed the rapid decline in the neighborhood's condition. From homelessness to violent criminal activity, there seems to be no light at the end of the tunnel. More recently, our community has been battling persistent noise pollution manifesting from the nightclubs and likewise establishments in the vicinity. These issues are major quality of life factors that negatively impact our community members. Loft Bar & Bistro was a major contributor to this problem. At one point, they were illegally playing live music from their rooftop patio. The music was beyond excessive and to the point of rattling our building. Community members relentlessly reached out to city departments such as the police, code enforcement, etc. We received no help at all and had to take matters into our own hands. We ended up paying our attorneys to draft numerous demands of cooperation. Finally, they budged (knowing their actions were illegal) and agreed to no longer play music from their rooftop patio. How outrageous is it that property tax paying community members received zero assistance from the local government that they pay into? This is a prime example of why we strongly oppose any modification or extension to Fuze's outdoor music hours. The few bucks that they profit from extending their outdoor music hours will cost community members vastly in terms of safety and security. The nefarious and criminal activities that stem from Fuze style establishments pose huge safety threats to our community members. Just a few months ago, our building sustained multiple gunshots from an exchange of gunfire that occurred in an adjacent parking lot. Not to our surprise, club goers were responsible for the heinous act. I invite you to go take a look at our bullet ridden building. This is just one incident of many that have occurred within our doorsteps because of the club goers that are patrons to Fuze and likewise establishments. I will be attending and speaking at the hearing that is scheduled for Tuesday, October 21, 2025. In addition, I will be generating a petition to garner the support of community members that oppose Fuze's request. We take this matter with the utmost level of seriousness and will tenaciously fight against Fuze's request. I appreciate your time and consideration. Please let me know if you have any questions.

I am writing, along with other homeowners in Downtown San Jose, to express my strong objection to the proposed Conditional Use Permit Amendment for **Fuze Bar and Grill** (File Nos. CPA16-005-01 & ER25-125) located at 58 S. 1st Street.

Primary Objection - Point 4

I am particularly opposed to Point 4, which seeks to remove the 10:00 p.m. music restriction and operation until 2:00 a.m.

Allowing this change would further increase the trouble we are having with safety, excessive noise, and disturbances for our downtown community.

Even under current restrictions, Fuze has demonstrated a pattern of non-compliance and lack of self-regulation over the past few years I've lived downtown:

- Regularly plays loud music past their licensed 10:00 p.m. cutoff
- Sound levels routinely exceed 87 decibels (sufficient to damage hearing) after hours, which causes my windows and my literal bed to vibrate. Fuze is also over 200 feet away, which means it is even louder on the patio.
- HOA representatives and individual residents have spoken to the applicant's management several times over these past few years, but all complaints to management have been ignored.
 - o In fact, the owner publicly denies that the verifiable facts stated in this letter are true.

Due to these current violations, I am routinely prevented from:

- Opening windows for fresh air overnight
- Getting adequate sleep, especially on nights later in the week and weekend

Extending hours until 2:00 a.m. would severely worsen these impacts and prioritize a problematic business over the health and safety of our entire downtown community.

Request for Denial

Given Fuze's documented pattern of violating current conditions and complete disregard for our community concerns, we strongly urge the City Council to **<u>DENY</u>** this permit amendment as requested.

If this establishment cannot operate responsibly under current restrictions, extending their hours would only exacerbate existing problems and set a dangerous precedent for downtown businesses.

Thank you for prioritizing the livability and safety of all downtown residents.

My name is Torrance Carroll and I am a resident San Jose, living near 2nd and 1st Streets. I am writing to express my strong opposition to the conditional use permit amendment for Fuze Bar and Grill (Case Nos. CPA16-005-01 & ER25-125).
