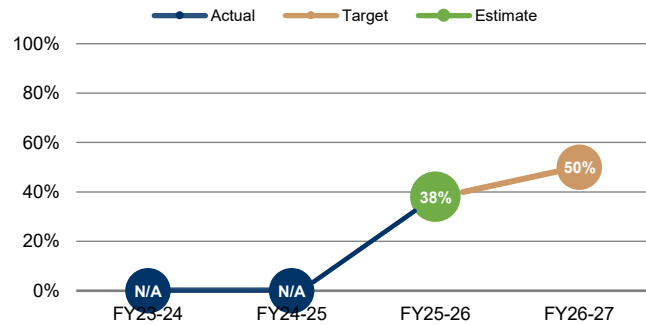

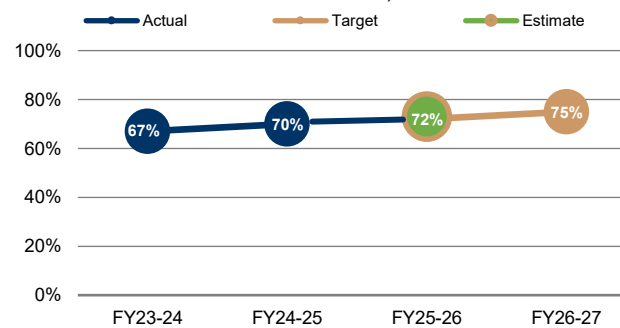
Park Condition Assessment Score

% of developed park acres by park condition assessment (PCA) score 95% or better (PRNS)



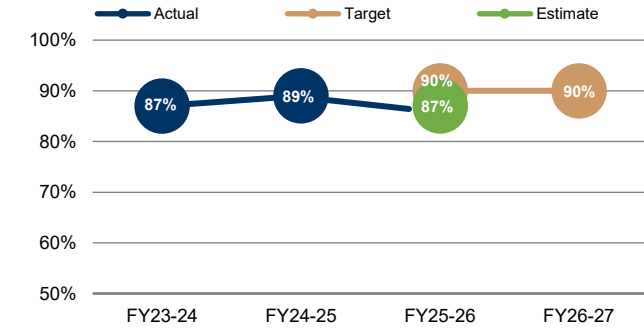
Neighborhood Physical Condition

% of residents who indicate that the physical condition of the neighborhood is about the same or better (Code Enforcement)



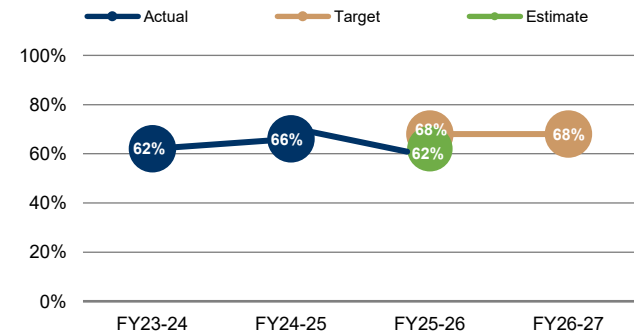
Animal Live Release Rate

% of animals that leave the shelter through adoption, rescue, transfer, or return to owner (PRNS)



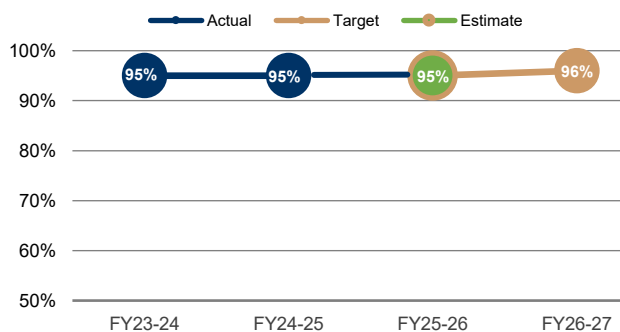
General Code Program Case On-Time Resolutions

% of General Code Program cases resolved within processing time targets (Code Enforcement)



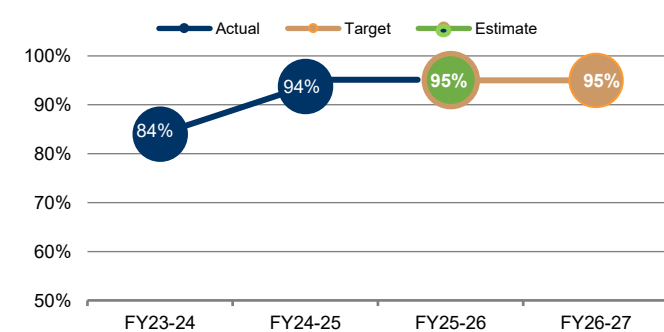
Library Service Quality Rating

NEIGHBORHOOD SERVICES CSA REDUCING UNSHELTERED HOMELESSNESS FOCUS AREA



Long-Term Goal: Move toward functional zero in unsheltered homelessness by managing a sustainable shelter system, reducing inflow, increasing throughput to permanent housing, and strengthening coordinated service delivery with the County.

Problem Area 1 : System Gaps. Gaps in services and coordination between the City and County slow service delivery and placement, particularly for high-acuity unsheltered individuals.

Problem Area 2: Limited Shelter-to-Housing Throughput. Limited throughput from streets-to-shelter-to-permanent placement, including housing, constrains new placements in shelter beds.

Problem Area 3: Sustainable Funding Sources. Sustainable funding sources for the City's system response to unsheltered homelessness are needed to support long-term operations and desired outcomes.

Problem Area 4: Public Space Movement and Cycling. Limited alternatives continue to shift unsheltered individuals across waterways, vehicles, downtown, & other public spaces faster than the broader system can resolve homelessness.

NEIGHBORHOOD SERVICES CSA CLEANING UP OUR NEIGHBORHOODS FOCUS AREA



Long-Term Goal: San José residents can enjoy a city with clean public spaces and well-maintained private property.

Problem Area 1: Blight on Private Property. Increasing case volumes, expanding scope, and static staffing for General Fund positions stretches Code Enforcement’s ability to resolve complaints quickly.

Problem Area 2: Graffiti. The City has developed a rapid and effective service for removal of graffiti on public property, but the volume of graffiti remains high, placing the burden on residents to continually report graffiti for removal.

Problem Area 3: Illegal Dumping. The volume of illegal dumping collected by the City continues to increase.

NEIGHBORHOOD SERVICES CSA 2026-2027 PRIORITIES / SERVICE DELIVERY



- Steward parks, trails, and public spaces and provide people of all ages access to healthy opportunities
- Deliver encampment trash/biowaste removal, neighborhood cleanliness services, neighborhood association engagement and volunteerism efforts, and maintain landscaping at gateway corridors
- Continue providing access to high-quality Library collections, programs, and services
- Continue contracted veterinary services including spay and neuter surgeries
- Implement recommendations from Code Enforcement's operational assessment
- Care for the animals in need in our community
- Continue to optimize shelter system management

NEIGHBORHOOD SERVICES CSA SUMMARY



- Maintains park maintenance, staff-led community and recreational programming, aquatics, scholarships, and nutritional programs
- Preserves current Library operating hours at branch locations
- Continues Family Friends and Neighbor (FFN) Caregiver Support Network Program for one-year
- Completes Implementation of the Code Enforcement Operational Assessment Transformation Work Plan
- Expands the Animal Shelter spay and neuter services for Trap, Neuter, and Release program and contracted veterinary services
- Continues to provide community-based grants focused on neighborhood beautification, youth safety, and community engagement
- Improves synchronization between outreach and shelter bed placement

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
